



Msgr. Jerry's Journal

Moving forward: Thanks again for your generosity in supporting the *Witness to Hope* Campaign. Our parish building committee is now meeting every two weeks to discuss our plans. At our last meeting we approved hiring a company to do a topography of our property. Since we are working with the city and the diocese, a topography is necessary. We will be meeting again this week. We are trying our



best to think not only short term, but what is best for the parish 20 years down the road.

Praying: If you are able, please join the Knights after 10 am Mass this Sunday to pray the Rosary.

The Worker: This Monday, May 1, is the Memorial of St. Joseph the Worker. St. Joseph labored to support his family. We have a wonderful St. Joseph's Guild at our parish. They do a lot of odd jobs for us and I am grateful to them. There is a Mass for them on Monday at St. Pius X Church. I hope to attend.

Regional gathering: The diocese asked us to host a regional gathering to discuss marriage preparation. It's being held in the Fr. Bush Center this Tuesday, May 2, at 7 pm. I think it's necessary that we try to improve our marriage prep.

National Day of Prayer: This Thursday, May 4, is a National Day of Prayer. Yes, so many things to pray for. At a recent meeting, Dr. Simon Lee mentioned the increased tension in Korea. Perhaps we can pray the rosary this day for peace in the Korean Peninsula.

Calendar Meeting: This Thursday is also the day when our staff gets together to finalize plans for the year (parishes operate on a July 1 – June 30 schedule). We always have a lot going on in our parish, especially with our school.

First Communion Masses: So excited for our second graders receiving First Holy Communion. We have four First Communion Masses scheduled: Saturday, May 6, at 5 pm; Sunday, May 7 at Noon; Saturday May 13, at 5 pm and Sunday, May 14 (Mother's Day) at Noon.

Diaconate Retreat: Next weekend I am leading a retreat in Holly for the permanent deacon candidates for the Diocese of Saginaw. Eight candidates and their wives will be on retreat. I'll be around for our First Communion Masses.

Good Man, Charlie Brown: Really enjoyed watching our grade-school students perform in the play. I appreciate our 4th grade teacher Margaret McGee and parent Beth Holyfield for their leadership and direction.

Lots of items: Our school auction is coming up on May 20. Anyone can attend. We have more than 120 silent auction items, as well as ten live auction items. Some of my family attended last year's event. They enjoyed it so much that they want to come back this year! The main focus for this year's auction is to supply funds for our new band program. Again, if anyone has any band equipment to donate to the school, please let the school know.

Fr. Swiat: I received an invitation to attend Fr. Jim Swiat's and Fr. Charlie Irvin's 50th anniversary to the priesthood on June 4 in DeWitt. They were ordained on June 3, 1967! Wow! Dan will return home on June 20 and come to the parish on June 28. I know he is very excited and happy to be assigned to our parish.

I ended up walking there to find a lacrosse match. That was the first time I've watched lacrosse live. I like the game, but I'll have to learn the rules. 

What's Happening Here

Saints for the Week (April 30 - May 6)

April 30: St. Pius V

Pope St. Pius V was born near Alessandria in Italy in 1504. He entered the Dominican Order and taught theology. After being ordained a bishop and named a cardinal, he became pope in 1566. He vigorously implemented the reform of the Church begun at the Council of Trent, promoted the spread of the faith and renewed the liturgy. He died on May 1, 1572.

May 1: St. Joseph the Worker

"May Day" has long been dedicated to labor and the working man. This feast in honor of St. Joseph the worker was instituted by Pope Pius XII in 1955. The pope expressed the hope that this feast would accentuate the dignity of labor and would bring a spiritual dimension to labor unions. It is very fitting that St. Joseph, a working man who became the foster-father of Christ and patron of the universal Church, should be honored on this day.

May 2: St. Athanasius

St. Athanasius was born at Alexandria. He received an excellent education and became an expert in Sacred Scripture. He was ordained a deacon at the age of 21. As the theologian of his bishop, Athanasius attended the Council of Nicea which promulgated the Nicene Creed and condemned Arianism which taught that Jesus Christ was not eternal with the Father, but was created in time. St. Athanasius became patriarch and dedicated his efforts to

implementing the decrees of the Council of Nicea. He was met with much opposition, being exiled for 17 years. He was accused of every kind of evil from embezzlement and treason to murder and sacrilege. Purified by these trials and atoning for any excessive intransigence in the name of orthodoxy, he died at Alexandria in 373. He wrote the life of St. Anthony which is a model of hagiography and the eremitical life.

May 3: St. Philip and St. James

This feast dates from the 6th century and was formerly celebrated on May 1 to commemorate the dedication of the basilica in Rome where the relics of Philip and James are preserved. Philip was called to be an apostle the day after Peter and Andrew. He responded immediately to the call, convinced that Jesus was the promised Messiah. Philip later preached the gospel in Phrygia, and possibly in Greece. He was martyred at Hierapolis and was buried there until his relics were transferred to Rome. James, the son of Alpheus and "brother" (cousin) of the Lord is also known as St. James the Less. He was so successful in winning converts to Christianity that the Scribes and Pharisees plotted his death. According to one account, he was thrown from the pinnacle of the Temple, and since he was not yet dead, he was stoned; finally he was dispatched by a blow to the head with a club. His martyrdom took place in the year 62.
