





Our Catholic Heritage

70th Pope – Honorius I

Born in Campania, elected pope October 25, 625. A capable administrator of the Church's patrimony. He spent large sums on building and restoring numerous Roman churches. In the area of doctrine and dogma however, he did not have the same success. He sent missionaries to almost all parts of the known world and instituted the feast of the Exaltation of the Holy Cross on September 14. He resolved the problem of the Eastern Church and the Schism of the Aquileia on the question of the "Three Chapters" (a schism that affected Chalcedonian Christianity in Northern Italy lasting from 553 to 698 AD). However, many years later at the third council of Constantinople in 680, he was condemned as a heretic by the sixth general council. Pope Honorius I died October 12, 638, and was buried in the Vatican Grottoes.



January 26: Sts. Timothy and Titus

Timothy had a Greek father and a Jewish mother named Eunice. Being the product of a "mixed" marriage, he was considered illegitimate by the Jews. It was his grandmother, Lois, who first became Christian. Timothy was a convert of Paul around the year 47 and later joined him in his apostolic work. He was with Paul at the founding of the Church in Corinth. Titus has the distinction of being a close friend and disciple of Paul, as well as a fellow missionary. He was Greek, apparently from Antioch. Even though Titus was a Gentile, Paul would not let him be forced to undergo circumcision at Jerusalem. Titus is seen as a peacemaker, administrator, and great friend. Paul's second letter to Corinth affords an insight into the depth of his friendship with Titus, and the great fellowship they had in preaching the gospel. When Paul was having trouble with the community at Corinth, Titus was the bearer of Paul's severe letter and was successful in smoothing things out.

Gospel Meditation

Encourage Deeper Understanding of Scripture

When I was a young seminarian, I asked a wise old priest how to pray better. He said simply, "Don't lie when you pray." He helped me to see how much energy I waste in trying to appear acceptable to God when I pray. For me, prayer was showing off for God and hiding what was ugly.

It's stunning that the Gospel of Matthew tells us of Jesus, **"He left Nazareth and went to live in Capernaum by the sea, in the region of Zebulon and Naphtali..."** This isn't just the Lord's relocation up north. It's his moving into places of shame and defeat. This region was where the enemy invasion of Israel began centuries before. Jesus left the comfortable confines of Nazareth and sought out a place of darkness, not to bring shame, but to announce the dawning of his light.

When we pray, we usually prefer Jesus to stay put in our little Nazareths — where we feel comfortable, successful, and in control. But he moves. He re-locates into the Zebulons and Naphtalis of our shame, embarrassment, fear, and sense of being defeated. The question for us is: will we allow him to take up residence in those places in our prayer time? Will we talk to him honestly about our places of darkness? If we do, we're no longer lying when we pray.

Virtual Presentation Focuses on Thomas Aquinas and his 'Fierce Wisdom' for Hard Times

St. Thomas Aquinas, a Dominican Friar, was a fierce proponent of science and religion working together in the revelation of God's creation. Episcopal priest and theologian Rev. 
