# A CUP OF JOE

Greetings in Christ, all!

On Tuesday of this week, I'll be gathering with all the priests in our Deanery. Please pray for me, that I will do a good job leading the deanery and that all of us will work together to help bring people closer to Christ.



On Friday of this week, I'll be leaving to work the Marriage Cruise I wrote about this last week.

This brings to mind the next part of the Updates that I've been sharing for the last couple weeks.

One of the big issues that we are facing as a Church is that we have fewer priests than at any point in our country's history.

In the US there are a little less than 25,000 priests covering our country. A little more than half of those are five years before retirement or working after retirement age. In the next few years we'll see the situation get more and more difficult.

What this tends to mean is a couple things:

# 1. Priests absolutely need to focus on the sacraments.

Many people want me to serve as a counselor or spiritual director, but I lack the skills and the time to be either. In response to this, we have a number of properly trained people to fill these roles. Please, allow us to serve you as we can, not as we can't.

# 2. Tragically, Masses will be canceled sometimes.

In 2023 Fr. Le and I set our vacation/retreat schedules for 2024. Priests were called to fill in for those dates over six months ago and many of the priests were already booked. Fr. Le and I both are deeply saddened that there will be Masses that simply can't be covered, but we are unable to do anything about it. Whenever possible, we will be sure you know which Masses we could not cover. We invite you to attend another Mass here or one at a local parish that fits your schedule.

Some days, due to sickness or emergency calls, you may find Mass canceled at the last minute. We rec-


ognize this as a tragedy, but we ask that you do not chastise or complain. Instead, pray. Ask God to send us more priests. Ask God to help us learn to live as the Church is, not as She used to be.

So, that's another update for us all. Thank you for taking the time to read it. I'll miss you all next week and will pray for you faithfully.

# STEWARDSHIP

I use GPS wherever I go and it serves me well most of the time. However, sometimes it leads me to a place that does not exist. Then there are those times when I am about to turn and the man inside my phone shouts out, "GPS signal lost" or "Rerouting!" The problem is when the area is unfamiliar to me, I have no choice but to listen. I could try to get where I am going by simple intuition or pulling over to look at a paper map, but I don't trust my sense of direction and haven't bought a paper map in close to a decade.

Many people move through life without any direction. They find themselves constantly rerouting and wondering when they will ever get to a satisfying final destination. What they need is a compass and a companion for the journey, yet they have no idea how to get either.

Prayer can serve as a compass and it connects us to a companion for the journey. Stewardship living is impossible without prayer. If we count on our own will and believe we can become fruitful without daily contact with the divine we can find ourselves looking for directions more than moving toward a destination. God through prayer will help us see all we have as gift. God through prayer will lead us away from materialism and selfishness toward freedom and generosity. Even when we fall to sin, the path back is clearer. God's GPS signal is never really lost.

#### Gospel Meditation

**Encourage Deeper Understanding of Scripture** 

We start telling lies around the age of three, the experts tell us. It's understandable. Lying is a god-like power. Whatever I want, I need only say it, and the world rearranges itself accordingly. It's amazing at first. But soon reality snaps back and I'm faced with a dilemma. If I remain committed to my lie, I start to fracture into pieces. My words and reality drift apart, and I find myself lost in a lonely world of further falsehoods and fear of being found out.

How marvelous, then, that Jesus begins his ministry by proclaiming: "Repent!" We tend to think it means "stop doing bad things," but it doesn't. It literally means "go beyond the mind you have." Think in a new way. It's painful to admit, but some portion of my mind is addicted to lietelling, usually to protect my ego or make life easier. To repent means to admit this tendency, to say, "I'm done lying," and to move beyond my split mind into a complete commitment to the truth. Perhaps that's why at Mass we together proclaim, "I have sinned in my thoughts, and in my words..." Repentance and truth-telling work together.

Those who know the twelve-step process of addiction recovery know this process well. The fourth step requires radical truth-telling: listing our moral defects. This isn't being scrupulous. Rather it is freedom from falsehood, and entrance into the real world. This week, I invite you to join me in this practice. Get your phone or



piece of paper. Answer the question: what are your true moral defects? Write them down. Remember, the Lord knows them already and loves you. We have a sacrament where this truth-telling is celebrated: Confession. Perhaps it is finally time to go beyond our childish lies.

For all the deceased members of my family, that in Your great mercy, Lord, You may forgive their sins and welcome them into eternal life...


For my relatives, friends, neighbors, coworkers and all who have assisted me throughout my life, in appreciation for the joys we have shared...



#### **Our Catholic Heritage**

122nd Pope - John X

Born in Tossignano, Italy, he was elected pope, bishop of Rome and nominal ruler of the Papal States in March 914. His election was due to intrigues though he disapproved of their inspirers. He was responsible for resolving the schism between the Eastern




and the Roman Church. In an attempt to unify Italy under the leadership of Berengar of Friuli, he crowned Berengar as Emperor in 915. He marched against the Saracens and routed them at the Garigliano River. In political matters. after a grave run in with Marozia and her husband Guido of Tuscany, he was taken prisoner, deposed, imprisoned, and finally murdered, most likely of suffocation in May 928. Pope John X pontificate occurred during the period known as the Saeculum obscurum (period of papal immorality). Pope John X was buried in St. John in Lateran.

#### Saint

#### January 21: St. Agnes

Almost nothing is known of this saint except that she was very young—12 or 13—when she was martyred in the last half of the third century. Various modes of death have been suggested—beheading, burning, strangling. Agnes was condemned, executed, and buried near Rome in a catacomb that eventually was named after her. The daughter of Constantine built a basilica in her honor


