Feast of the Presentation of the Lord (Candlemas) - February 1 & 2 at All Weekend Masses

Forty days after the Nativity of the Lord, we celebrate when Jesus was presented in the Temple by Mary and Joseph. Luke's Gospel highlights the role of Simeon and Anna, two righteous Jews who recognized Jesus as the long-awaited Messiah. Simeon's prayer concerning the special role of Jesus stated that Jesus is "a light for revelation to the Gentiles." This phrase eventually originated the custom of blessing candles on this day. Thus February 2 is also known as Candlemas Day. This day is indeed a rich feast to be savored.



We invite you to bring your candle(s) to **all weekend Masses on February 1st and 2nd** to be blessed, along with the candles we use for Mass. During Mass, you will have the opportunity to raise your candle(s) to be blessed. May your blessed candles symbolize Christ's role as the light of the world.

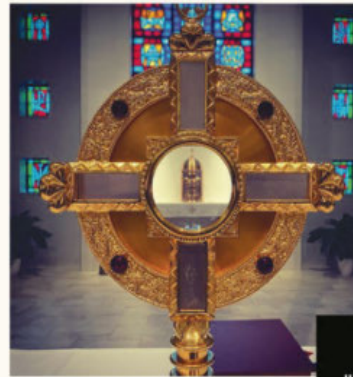
High School Subsidy Application

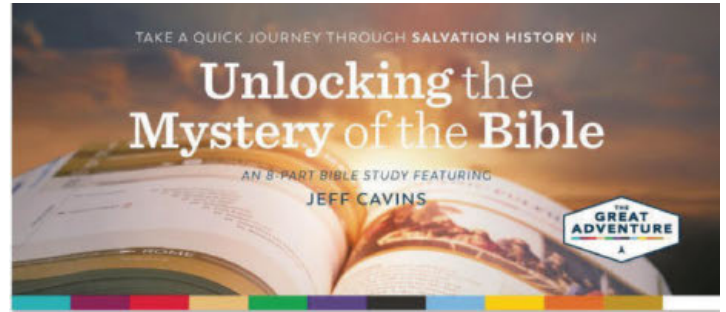

175th - Pope Celestine III

Born in Rome circa 1106, into nobility. Birth name, Giacinto Bobone. His papacy began on March 30, 1191 at the age of 85. Pope Celestine III immediately fought with the King of Sicily. The King kidnapped his own wife, Empress Constance, who was also the pope's aunt. The pope threatened to excommunicate the King if he did not release her. Eventually, soldiers working for the King brought the Empress to the border and let her go. Known for his official motto, "Go in Thy Path," he believed everyone should follow their paths. At age 92, having served as pope for more than six years, Celestine III looked forward to stepping down from the papacy. Cardinals working for the Church refused to let him resign. Pope Celestine III died on January 8, 1198 from natural causes.

THE PROGRESS DELUSION

A great deal of good has been accomplished in the name of progress. Examples include greater life expectancy, reduced infant mortality, expanding food supply, safe water for much of the world, and access to education and healthcare. But the abuse of workers, the exploitation of poor nations, the devastating atrocities of war, genocide and environmental extortion have also been perpetrated under the banner of "progress".

We have also been too quick to declare victory in our quest for progress. Consider the phones we carry in our pockets. We have more communication than ever before and this is hailed as progress, but do we have better relationships? Better relationships would be human flourishing. But even the most casual observer comes to the conclusion that these devices have wreaked havoc on our lives and relationships.

If the goal of progress is to improve the well-being of people and bring about human flourishing, how can something that dehumanizes people be considered progress?

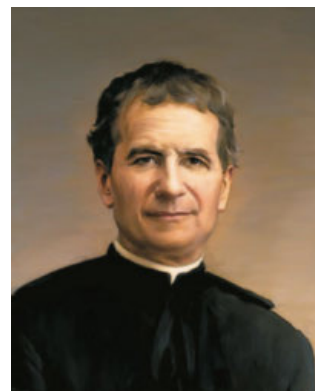

January 31: St. John Bosco

Encouraged during his youth to become a priest so he could work with young boys, John was ordained in 1841. His service to young people started when he met a poor orphan and instructed him in preparation for receiving Holy Communion. He then gathered young apprentices and taught them catechism. After serving as chaplain in a hospice for working girls, John opened the Oratory of St. Francis de Sales for boys. Several wealthy and powerful patrons contributed money, enabling him to provide two workshops for the boys, shoemaking and tailoring. By 1856, the institution had grown to 150 boys and had added a printing press for publication of religious and catechetical pamphlets.
