

Today I want to share with you updates on the status of the new



### **Chalking the Door**

20 + C + M + B + 23

This year we invite you to join us in the tradition of

"chalking the door" to celebrate the Epiphany. The Epiphany marks the arrival of the magi to the place where Jesus was born and the end of Christmas. This year it will be celebrated on Sunday, January 8 (typically celebrated on January 6, the 12th day of Christmas). Envelopes with the prayer and blessed chalk are available in the Gathering Space for you to participate at your home.



"Chalking the door" is a sign and symbol of asking God's blessing upon those who live, work, or visit throughout the coming year. In Exodus, the Israelites marked their doors with blood so that the Lord would pass over their homes; but in this service, we mark our doors with chalk as a sign inviting God's presence and blessing into our homes.

The letters C M B come from the traditional names for the three kings: Caspar, Melchior, and Balthazar. It is also an abbreviation for "Christus Mansionem Benedicat" which means, "May Christ bless this dwelling!" The first and last numbers simply refer to the current year.

Pray: Lord God of heaven and earth, you revealed your only begotten Son to every nation by the guidance of a star. Bless this house and all who live here and all who visit. May we be blessed with health, kindness of heart, gentleness and the keeping of your law. Fill us with the light of Christ, that our love for each other may go out to all. We ask this through Christ our Lord. Amen.





### 68th Pope - Deusdedit I

Born in Rome, he was elected on October 10, 615. With heroic abnegation he attended lepers and the plague stricken. He was the first to use seals of lead for Bulls and pontifical decrees. His is the oldest pontifi-



cal preserved in the Vatican. He had excellent relations with Byzantium, as well as for the charity he showed upon victims of a terrible earthquake and plague that violently struck the people in 615. Pope Deusdedit I died November 8, 618.



### January 13: St. Hilary of Poitiers

Raised a pagan, he was converted to Christianity when he met his God of nature in the Scriptures. His wife was still living when he was chosen, against his will, to be the bishop of Poitiers in France. He was soon taken up with battling what became the scourge of the fourth century, Arian-ism, which denied the divinity of Christ. When Emperor Constantius ordered all the bishops of the West to sign a condemnation of Athanasius, the great defender of the faith in the East, Hilary refused and was banished from France to far off Phrygia.



Eventually he was called the "Athanasius of the West."



# Gospel Meditation Encourage Deeper Understanding of Scripture



### The Epiphany of the Lord

A friend of mine is a young priest who teaches high school physics at a Catholic boys' prep school. Like many today, the boys often think science and religion are enemies. So, he delights in their raised eyebrows when he reminds them his first full-time job as a priest was to be an astrophysicist. He cataloged the size, shape, and matter of distant stars. He tells them, "Science gave me more love for God, not less."

The Magi were something like scientist-astronomers. Like today's scientists, they employed disciplined methods of discovering dependable patterns in the world. Their rigorous commitment to the truth led them to the joy of discovering Jesus. Their love for knowledge leads them to worship the Source of all knowledge. Luke says of them, "They were overjoyed at seeing the star."

We may see the universe as cold and empty and feel sad. But why should we do that? The Magi, like my priest-friend, show us there is another way to experience the world. We use our intelligence to discover the beautiful patterns in the world — in mathematics, physics, astronomy, biology, neuroscience, and so on — and allow this to lead us to greater love for God. So, my fellow Magi: the world needs us to be overjoyed at finding God in science and, finally and fully, in Jesus.


