

# What's Happening Here

#### A Cup of Joe

Greetings in Christ all!

I wanted to start right off and thank God for our prayer ministry here at Holy Family. The feedback from the healing service continues to come in and a lot of people experienced the Lord and His Holy Spirit that night. The people who are praying with folks have been preparing for so long and the fruits are amazing. For my part, I have

sought the prayers of our team a few times and been blessed each time by their loving and caring response. Please don't hesitate to check out this wonderful work of the Lord in our midst!

Chuck Wright, our new business manager, is helping a lot and I'm so excited for his time here. We've had two amazing business managers in a row and I can't believe we now have a third. I thank the Lord for him daily, as I did for Kevin and Brian.



I've had lots of questions on the "what's next?" front concerning our church, so I thought I'd take some time to walk you through a couple reminders.

In December of this year, our two campaigns (Witness to Hope and Restore the Temple) will officially end. Everyone who made pledges will be finished by then. If you made a pledge, but your situation requires that you cannot keep it or need to modify it, please just let us know. We know things change!

If you are able to finish it or if you plan on doing so, please accept my gratitude. I cannot believe what our God has done because of you in such a short amount of time.

Once December finishes, we can begin financial planning for the things that need to be done: moving the organ pipes and machinery back into church is going to be by far the most expensive, but also one of, if not THE most important. We also have the covered drop off area at our front doors that is not yet covered...haha...that's on the list. We've got these and a couple other things that we will get to work on so that everyone knows the cost of the project and how we plan to go about getting it.

In terms of our current projects, our baptismal font is being worked on though we don't yet have a sense as to when it will be done, but it is paid for through the generosity of donors, praise God. We are also working on new Mary and Joseph statues near the sanctuary in our church and a donor has purchased a Solanus Casey statue that will also be put up.

The final project that we are currently working on is a Reliquary. Hopefully, you remember that we were gifted five First Class Saint Relics and are making a prayer area for those relics. This will be located to the left of the altar as you look at it. I'm really excited about that!

Our future projects...the "some day" type things include a wall mural of Saints in the soffits where the vents are, a communion rail and a couple decorative things in the sanctuary.

That's where we are and I'm so excited about it. God has been so good to us, it's overwhelming some days.

I think the biggest question is about debt. What kind of debt can we expect once all the pledges are in and we match that up with what we owe for the church construction?

Remember when we began to build, the estimated debt was for between \$200,000 and \$800,000? That was what we were expecting to need to borrow from the diocese to complete the church.

Well, if the pledges come in as they have, it is my joyful duty to let you know that we won't have any debt. None. This is particularly shocking because we also paid off a significant debt that was owed to the Michigan Catholic Conference for our insurance.

I want you to read that again and rejoice with me. This is nuts...I just can't believe what God has done and continues to do. This happened because of the strong and prudent guidance of our finance council and your crazy generosity. I am so blessed by you and I thank you with all my heart.

This is a long one, but I hope you find it helpful. Thank you for loving me, letting me love you and for all of us together loving God as best we can!



In addition to supplies, we greatly appreciate monetary donations (to Holy Family, specifying Outreach), which can be used to support our efforts.







### Knights of Columbus Baby Bottles for Life

The Knights of Columbus councils in Genesee County are taking on an initiative in Flint that should certainly help Defend Life for the unborn. This initiative is to place three Ultrasounds in the city of Flint by the end of 2021.



The locations for these Ultrasounds include the Pregnancy Resource Center on Saginaw St., Pregnancy Help Clinic on Flushing Rd (presently under renovation), and The Luke Project 52 of Flint.

The cost for these three Ultrasounds is approximately \$110,000 with 50% being funded by our local Knights of Columbus councils and parish communities throughout the county and the other 50% being funded by the Supreme Council, headquarters of the Knights of Columbus.

You can help with your donation to these Ultrasounds through your local Knights Baby Bottle Drive and/or a one-time contribution. Any time over the next couple months, full baby bottles or cash/checks can be placed in the bottle collection box in the gathering space. 
#### Confirmation



#### October 17: St. Ignatius of Antioch

Ignatius was a convert to Christianity. When he was named the second bishop of Antioch, Syria, Ignatius became a successor of Saint Peter. In 107, Emperor Trajan tried to force Christians to renounce their religion. Ignatius allowed soldiers to bind him in a rickety cart and lead him to Rome for martyrdom. As his cart rolled into towns, local bishops and Christians came to meet and encourage him. On the journey, Ignatius wrote seven letters to the churches he left behind. The letters give insight into the growth of theology. He asked his people to gather around the Eucharist and to care for "the widow, the orphan, the oppressed, as well as those in prison, the hungry and the thirsty." (Letter to the Church at Smyrna 6.2) Ignatius was devoured by wild beasts in the Roman amphitheater.

#### **Gospel Meditation**

Encourage Deeper Understanding of Scripture

"What do you wish me to do for you?" Whether we realize it, this is a question God is always asking. It's an important question because the answer we provide will reveal a great deal about where our hearts lie. Our requests of God can often appear very noble and altruistic. They consist of requests for healing for someone in need of prayers, successful resolution of a personal conflict, assistance in overcoming a disease and myriad other desires for both ourselves and others. We are especially concerned about those we love and can easily find ourselves bringing their struggles to God for a hearing in our prayer.

Is that really all that prayer is about? The woman in today's Gospel, having been put in her place by Jesus, was only looking out for the wellbeing of her sons. She was doing what mothers do, protecting and securing the livelihood of

her children. But she was sadly mistaken, her request was not granted. We all make this same misguided mistake from time to time. The goal of prayer is not to convince God of the worthi-



ness of our agenda or to gain a hearing. Sometimes we believe that the more we multiply our prayers or discover the right combination of supplications that we will receive more of God's attention. That's not how it works. Even though God desires to hear, know, and be an intimate part of what is on our minds, it goes much deeper.

What we need from God is a relationship. It's a relationship that guides and immerses us in the very stuff of life and in the direction of the Gospel. This relationship sees God's kingdom and agenda, not our own, as what is most important. It builds the strength of character necessary to bring God's Gospel into a world that may not receive it with open arms. It may cause us discomfort and suffering. We are asked to heroically journey with God through suffering, hardship, ridicule, and even death! Ultimately, our desire from God must become our desire for God. It is only when this happens that the powerful words "thy will be done" will be found with sincerity and humility on our lips. Whatever God wishes becomes what we wish as we see this glorious union of wills. Our humble lives will then become powerful witnesses, and what happens to us in God's eternal kingdom the result of his mercy. We become true servants and find ourselves discovering God's definition of success. That definition has nothing at all to do with status, income, or privilege.






