

St. Michael the Archangel



A CUP OF JOE

Greetings in Christ, all!

So...in the homily this weekend, I talked about (or am going to talk about!) the campaign that our diocese is running: The Saints and Scholars Campaign.

In the homily, I pointed out that the money raised is going into three funds: the largest for teacher retention and support, the second is for tuition relief,



and the third is to help schools meet some needs for special education. The rest of the funds will come back to the parish for those things we need.

I also pointed out that none of the money "goes to the diocese." The diocese already paid for the campaign and all associated costs. Every penny raised will go directly into the endowments I listed above to be spent specifically on what the money was raised for.

The diocese has given our parish a goal of \$2.4 million. If we raise that, we will receive 20% back to our parish (\$420,000). The rest will go directly to the endowments. Here at Holy Family, we asked to add to our goal and so we are seeking \$3 million. If we raise \$3 million, we will receive \$1,020,000 of it.

Why did we add? There is no good way to say this, but we are at a point in the life of our parish campus where we simply must address both normal issues that come up in any property, but also the many areas that have been neglected for a very, very long time. As a result, we have a list of critical needs that simply have to be addressed. Prayer and common sense pointed us to two needs that simply must be addressed as soon as possible: Our Outreach Facility and our drainage issues.

Our previous pastor committed to the City of Grand Blanc that we would demolish our current Outreach facility, as well as all the little barns and garages on our property. We are years past the date that we promised to have them down. We need to get those down and build a structure from which we can care for the poor and store our tools, tractors, etc. That's our first priority simply because we promised.

Our second priority is our drainage issue. We have a very serious drainage issue that manifests in the area between our church, gym, rectory and office area. This is an extremely destructive problem that has already made the priest's garage unsavable and if we don't do something soon, more buildings will be in trouble. I can get into more detail later, but it's something we absolutely have to address.

Will \$1,020,000 solve both issues? Probably not, but we didn't feel it right to overshoot. At the same time, I am confident that if we all sacrifice appropriately, we can not only hit our goal, but pass it. We simply must pull the rope together.

So, our hope is that we can raise at least \$3,000,000 in pledges to meet the goal for the diocese and begin to address these two issues. Please pray. Please contribute. At this point, only half of our parishioners give regularly to the parish. I want to be clear and sensitive here: if you can't give, I totally get it. Please pray. We are never unable to pray!

But, if you are in a position to help in any way, I am asking you to do so. Just hitting the goal will help us a lot and I'm even praying we go over; we have a lot of needs here. I promise you that we are careful with the money you give and are accountable to our diocese and the parish finance council.

I ask for your financial sacrifice with a clear conscience. You will be getting a letter from our Bishop asking you to participate. We have scheduled a couple of events that you can come to, learn more and hopefully make a pledge. We also have some parish ambassadors who may be calling you to see if you need any more info or assistance in order to pledge. Please pray and plan accordingly.

If you cannot pledge, just let them know when they call; no judgments here. I trust that everyone will be doing their best and praying for the success of the campaign is a huge gift.

Thank you so much. I am so grateful to God for you.


"October for Others"





October 20: St. Paul of the Cross

Paul Francis Danei was born in Italy in 1694, the second of 16 children. Because of his father's financial difficulties, Paul had to leave school to help support his family. At age 20, Paul joined the Venetian army that



was defending the faith. After a year, he went back to a life of prayer and penance. Then God called him to form a group of men dedicated to preaching parish missions. These men, called Passionists, would preach the mystery of Christ crucified - the mystery of the Father's love - in hopes that Christians would turn from their sins and rededicate their lives to Christ.

161st Pope - Gelasius II

Born in Gaeta, appointed a cardinal in 1088 and papal chancellor 1089, finally elected pope on January 24, 1118.



Attacked in the Basilica of the Lateran, he was imprisoned by the rebel Cencio

Frangipane for his continued support to end the administrative conflict between the Catholic Church and European monarchs over the power to appoint church officials. When he was freed by Genoese sailors, he fled to Gaeta from where, dressed as a pilgrim, he returned to Rome. He eventually moved to Cluny where he died and was buried at the monastery of Cluny.

Gelasius II was pope for only one year from 1118 to 1119. Pope Gelasius II died around 58 years old on the 28th of January 1119.

Holy Moments Explained -

Why Do Holy Moments Make Us Happy?



When we are doing what is good for us and what is morally good, we experience an undeniable sense of fulfillment. The ultimate feel-good sensations come from aligning our lives with what is good, true, right, just, and noble.

Holy Moments feel good. They make us incredibly happy. You are not imagining it, and it's not just metaphorical. Every Holy Moment is an act of generosity, and scientist have discovered that generosity releases three hormones that are critical for a human being to flourish.

The first is serotonin. This regulates happiness and mood in general.

The second is dopamine. This is responsible for allowing us to experience pleasure, satisfaction and motivation.

And the third is oxytocin. This is the hormone that is released during childbirth, sex, breastfeeding, exercise, while hugging, holding hands, listening to music, and sharing a meal with friends.



HERE AND THERE



From a young age, I loved winning at sports. I confess that winning was a bit of an addiction. It was probably coming from a deep desire for attention and affirmation from others. Nevertheless, it was a driving motivation for me. Baseball, soccer, track, table tennis, and whatever else I could find was a chance to win. Competition was my obsession.

Another John, and his brother James, demonstrate a kind of wildly competitive obsession when they dare to say to Jesus: "Grant us to sit, one at your right hand and one at your left, in your glory" (Mark 10:37). Their audacity arouses an indigent reaction from the other apostles, who are clearly raw that these two are out to win the highest spots.

How does Jesus respond to us in our desires for greatness? The same way he does to James and John. He does not criticize them for their desire for glory. But he does highlight their ignorance ("you do not know what you are asking."). Then he invites them to be champions of true greatness: by drinking not the cup of worldly victory, but his cup of self-giving suffering love, to be the "slave of all." The true winners are slaves of love. This week, dare to tell Jesus what your ambitions truly are. Hear him call you to an even greater victory.


