




St. Michael the Archangel

CUP

Greetings in Christ, all! This weekend we hear about Jesus and the Census Tax. The Census tax was a flat tax

levied once a year on all Non-Roman Citizens within the Roman Empire. You had to pay it with a specific type of coin, a coin that had the image of the current Emperor (although they didn't call them emperor, we do) and some sort of inscription. Here is an image of the specific coin Jesus would likely have been holding when the story occurred:



For example, the inscription on the denarius (left) in the Smithsonian collection reads, "Ti Caesar Divi Avg F Avgvstvs" or "Caesar Augustus Tiberius, son of the Divine Augustus" and it features the portrait of Emperor Tiberius, who ruled between AD 14 to 37.



As you can imagine, Jews did not like these coins for three reasons: one, they were paying their oppressors. Two, it broke their understanding of the commandment forbidding graven images. Three, it indicates that the Emperor was divine. I thought you might find this interesting.



109th Pope - Adrian III

Born in Rome, he was elected pope on May 17, 884. He established that imperial confirmation was unnecessary to consecrate the Pope. He worked to help the people of Italy in a very troubled time of famine and war. Having been invited by Charles the Gross to visit France to participate in the diet of worms, he died July, 885, during the journey at San Cesario and was buried in the Ab-



bey of Nonantola near Modena. Historians today believe that he died of quinsy, which is a type of tonsil infection.

The Papal Flag Flies at HFS

Thanks to the Harris Family, we are now flying the Papal Flag under the Stars & Stripes! The flag consists of two vertical bands, one of gold or yellow (hoist side) and one of white with the crossed keys of Saint Peter and the Papal Tiara centered in the white band. The crossed keys consist of a golden and a silver key, in which the silver key is placed in the dexter position. This is the official emblem of the independent state of Vatican City.

Feast Day | October 28



St. Jude, known as Thaddaeus, was a brother of St. James the Lesser. He was one of the 12 Apostles of Jesus. He is pictured in many ways: sometimes with a club (he was beaten to death), other times with a flame about him (he was at Pentecost). Sometimes you'll see him with a book (He wrote the Book of Jude in the New Testament), other times with a tool or holding a picture of Jesus. St. Jude was a son of Clopas and his mother was the Virgin Mary's cousin. Jude traveled extensively preaching the Gospel all over. He is believed to have been martyred either in Armenia or Beirut. Following his death, St. Jude's body was brought to Rome and left in a crypt in St. Peter's Basilica. Today you can find him in the left transept of St. Peter's Basilica under the main altar of St. Joseph. He shares the tomb with the apostle Simon the Zealot. Many people came to St. Jude's grave to pray and reported powerful miracles as a result. This led to him receiving the title, "The Saint for the Hopeless and Despaired." Two Saints, St. Bridget of Sweden and St. Bernard, had visions from God asking them to accept St. Jude as "The Patron Saint of the Impossible."

"O most holy apostle, Saint Jude, faithful servant and friend of Jesus, the Church honors and invokes you universally as the patron of hopeless cases, and of things almost despaired of. Pray for me, who am so miserable. Make use, I implore you, of that particular privilege accorded to you, to bring visible and speedy help where help was almost despaired of.

Come to my assistance in this great need, that I may receive the consolation and succor of Heaven in all my necessities, tribulations, and sufferings, particularly (here make your request) and that I may praise God with you and all the elect throughout eternity." Amen.





HERE AND THERE

Gospel Meditation

Encourage Deeper Understanding of Scripture

With little more than a year until the United States' national elections, I find myself feeling, like many Catholics, both dread and energized. Dread, because our democratic republic can be a messy endeavor and campaigns a long, nasty, and unedifying slog; energized, because hope for positive societal change can be enticing and engaging. As a pastor, I see similar conflicting attitudes in those whom I serve. How can Catholics best engage our political arena in a way which is truly helpful and worthwhile?

This weeks' gospel reading offers wisdom in this regard. Jesus says, "Render therefore to Caesar the things that are Caesar's, and to God the things that are God's." This riddle forces us to answer for ourselves a hidden question: what is the relationship between political and divine authority? Two common but false answers lead to mischief. If we answer that the two are equivalent, politics becomes our absolute authority. This happens whenever religion is slave to the state, as in the travesty of the pro-Nazi German Christian movement in the 1930s and 40s. It also usually occurs when there is an official state religion. If we answer that the two are totally unrelated, we end up with an unchecked aggressive secularist state as we often experience now. Thus, religion becomes a weak and private pastime.

What's a better alternative? At our best, Christians hold that political authority does indeed have its own legitimate autonomy but is nested within God's all-encompassing authority. Think, for example, of Rev. Dr. Martin Luther King Jr.'s respect for politics while also being able to criticize unjust human laws because he recognized a higher heavenly law. In other words, Caesar owns politics — and God owns Caesar. So, we should allow Jesus' words to lead us to have a deep respect and willingness to peacefully engage in politics without making that engagement our religion. We bring our faith to bear on our politics knowing confidently that Caesar isn't God — but he is indeed God's.


