A Cup of Joe

Greetings in Christ!

I'm writing this article way ahead of time, but when I finished last week's article, I figured, why not keep going? Much like I do in my homilies sometimes...haha.

So, last week I shared with you about where we are going with the Church building itself. Some of this is happening because at the Priest Convocation we were invited to work out what we hope, what we work for, what our goals are, etc.

In terms of our future, I obviously hope to continue our work on the Church that I shared with you. The Mass is at the heart of who we are as Catholics and so it all begins and ends with our Church.



Beyond our Church building, I think about our school a lot. I'm working on a fund for tuition and I know our diocese has a very aggressive plan for helping with tuition as well. I don't know if you remember this, but the biggest part of the Witness to Hope Campaign was to establish an endowment for Catholic education and that worked really well. I think I already told you this, but what the diocese learned in offering so much help was that a lot of help is needed to deal with the rising cost of education. God has gotten so SO far, I know He'll meet us there too.

As I've shared, our bricks and mortar need work and the way the property drains water and salt is a huge issue for us. We'll be going after that too.

We've got a BIG year of change coming in our care for the poor. We do a great job at this and Msgr. (now Bishop!) Vincke started a fantastic idea with Deacon Denny that is finally reaching fruition. The idea is to work with other Christian Churches that want to help us serve the poor. Doing so will expand our ability to help and further our care for the most vulnerable members of our society. This is a central work of Christianity and I'll be sharing some great news about all of that.

I also have been working on personal goals, small and large. I want to serve you well and continue to take good care of my dad, but I also recognize I need to be more conscious of taking care of myself: taking walks, stopping before I get wiped out, etc.

One of the things I want to work on as well is my habit of making fun of myself. A couple of you lovingly shared with me that you don't like it when I call myself dumb or make negative comments about myself. My Mom hated that too and I think I've let my guard down there. Once it was

pointed out to me twice in a 24-hour stretch, I made an effort to notice and I see I've really got into that habit again. I've taken it to prayer and I'm going to continue to go to war on that.

Fr. Le and I want to strive to have prayer times together and we are making a schedule of little 15-minute prayer times each day where we head over to the Church and check in with Jesus twice a day together. I'm excited about that.

So...lots of updates...our future is filled with wonderful challenges and blessings. All that we are called to comes down to a simple idea: We Pray, we serve, we grow. This is what Christians do and everything in this parish will continue to move toward that divine hyperfocus.

Thank you for letting me be a part of this family. I'm so very blessed.

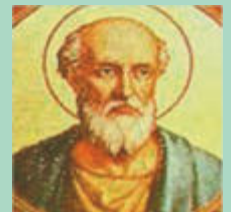

What's Happening Here

Gospel Meditation

Encourage Deeper Understanding of Scripture

When we see God with true sincerity of heart and God passes us along our way, it is only then that we will be able to cry out, "Jesus, son of David, have pity on me!" We have to truly want to be healed by, and in union with, God in order for us to reach out to him. If God is only an abstract idea, theory, or someone found in the pages of a book, there is no motivation for a relationship and no desire to seek him. God needs to be real in order for faith to be real. It's all about the journey.



St. Augustine reminds us that "to fall in love with God is the greatest romance; to seek Him the greatest adventure; to find Him the greatest human achievement." We strive after many things and mercy is not always one of them. We think that we can find fulfillment and healing in other things only to discover that we are still short and empty. From the moment human beings were created, God has been calling us and seeking us. He has been walking right beside the human story from the minute He first breathed life into the first human soul. Are we able to recognize God as He walks with us? At some point we have to realize that there is only one way to satisfy the deepest longings of the human heart and that is in relationship with our Creator. We are called to this. However, we make the huge error of thinking that what we are hearing is coming from somewhere else. We become confused. Every human being would certainly profit with wisdom if they realized Who calls them and to Whom they belong.

Then and only then will we realize that it is only our Divine Master who can give us true vision and heal us. Once we recognize and reach out for the merciful presence of our loving Maker, we will be able to see with our soul, understanding the true nature and depth of all things. God's mercy is always available. It doesn't matter how far we have strayed or how blind we become, God patiently waits to console us, guide us and heal us. All we need to do is desire Him. Once we reach out, we also realize that there is no greater love to be found than God's, no human adventure that comes even close to the thrill of a spiritual search, and no human achievement even remotely as satisfying as union with Him. This is where we belong. This is salvation.

Knights of Columbus Baby Bottles for Life

The Knights of Columbus councils in Genesee County are taking on an initiative in Flint that should certainly help Defend Life for the unborn. This initiative is to place three Ultrasounds in the city of Flint by the end of 2021.



The locations for these Ultrasounds include the Pregnancy Resource Center on Saginaw St., Pregnancy Help Clinic on Flushing Rd (presently under renovation), and The Luke Project 52 of Flint.

The cost for these three Ultrasounds is approximately \$110,000 with 50% being funded by our local Knights of Columbus councils and parish communities throughout the county and the other 50% being funded by the Supreme Council, headquarters of the Knights of Columbus.

You can help with your donation to these Ultrasounds through your local Knights Baby Bottle Drive and/or a one-time contribution. Any time over the next couple months, full baby bottles or cash/checks can be placed in the bottle collection box in the gathering space. Recognize God in Your Ordinary Moments

Giving as God does

Ask yourself this question — what would you pray for if you really believed God could and would do anything for you? In my experience, we all have something. We all have that miracle we're afraid to request, afraid we will be disappointed.

Do we doubt God's readiness to give because we ourselves have such an imperfect understanding of charity and love? Maybe if we had better faith in God we would be more ready to give of ourselves — and maybe if we were more ready to give of ourselves, we would understand more clearly the ways of God.

Because we're not really afraid that God can't do something. We know He can do anything. What we're afraid of is that He will do what He always does: give us what we need, not what we want.

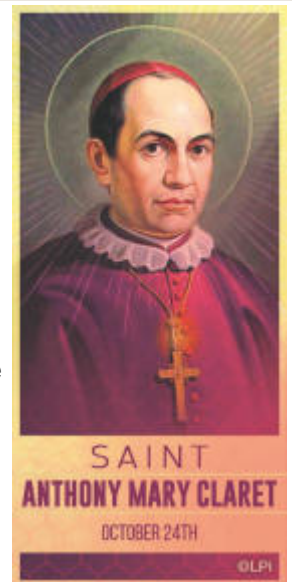
Have you ever had a friend in need and you just wanted to give them something — a meal, a phone call, a text? Not because you knew it would help, but simply because you wanted to reach out. And have they ever said to you: It wasn't so much what you gave, but the fact that you did. You gave them what they needed even if it wasn't what they specifically asked for.

When we give in this manner, we are giving as God does. Sometimes we are afraid to ask because we don't want to be disappointed. But remember, the blind man on the road got what he asked for, but he would have gotten what he needed even if his answer had been the opposite. God's generosity is always reckless, and it's always perfect.

By age twenty-one Anthony had been educated and was in much demand for his skill as a weaver. While suffering because of poor health, Anthony imagined himself as a Carthusian monk. He went to the bishop for advice. The bishop suggested that he first go to the diocesan seminary and then, if he wished, leave and become a monk. Anthony followed this advice and enjoyed seminary life. He founded a society of missionaries, and after being named bishop of Cuba, he won renown for his pastoral zeal. After returning to Spain, he continued to work for the Church. He died at Fontfroide in France in 1870.
