Mass Schedule

Saturday Vigil: 4 p.m.

Sunday: 8 a.m., 10 a.m. (LIVE), 12 p.m.

Monday - Saturday: 8 a.m. (LIVE) (Playback available on YouTube)

Are there still restrictions?

- Masks are encouraged.
- Singing is still not encouraged
- Bathroom use is discouraged
- If possible, please bring your own cleaning wipes
- Holy Communion cannot be taken to the homebound
- If you receive the Eucharist on the tongue, please kneel, raise your chin for the priest.

Will I still be able to watch Mass at home?

Yes! We will continue to livestream our 8 am Masses Monday Saturday and our 10 am Mass on Sunday. Our Bishop has extended the dispensation through November 28th. Elderly, people who are ill or have health issues, and children under seven years old are asked to not attend Mass.

What about confessions?






