



On Monday this week, our Church celebrates The Feast of St. Jude, the Apostle. We are so crazy blessed to have a first-class relic of him right in our church. If you come to church on Monday, don't miss a chance to be blessed with this relic. Please check out our handout for more information about this amazing Saint. Technically, his name was/is "Judas." The problem is, of course, the other disciples named Judas who betrayed Jesus. In order to avoid confusion, the Church has simply referred to him as "Jude." It is a rare and amazing gift that we have his relic, let's make sure to take advantage of this blessing!

All Saints is this Friday and All Souls is this Saturday. These are two very significant feasts for us. On All Saints Day (Friday), we remember and rejoice in the prayers and examples of the Saints. We will pray Masses at 8 am and 6 pm. We are offering two Masses because this is a Holy Day of Obligation.

On All Souls Day (Saturday), we pray for all of our beloved dead and we will have our usual Mass at 8 am. I'll be praying this Mass with you, as we light candles for all those in our parish family who have gone to be with the Lord in the last year. Beyond going to Mass, It's a good idea to take

your family to a family grave this week and do some cleanup and prayers. Praying for the dead is one of the seven best things we can do as Christians. Please be sure to come pray these holy days with us!

So, that's it for this week. I'll keep reminding us all of the campaign for the next couple of months. I can't wait for the day I get to tell you that we hit or passed our goal!

Jesus bless you all. I'm so grateful to God that I get to be your priest.


Mass of Remembrance | All Souls' Day Saturday, November 2nd

Relics at Holy Family

Feast Day | October 28



St. Jude, known as Thaddaeus, was a brother of St. James the Lesser. He was one of the 12 Apostles of Jesus. He is pictured in many ways: sometimes with a club (he was beaten to death), other times with a flame about him (he was at Pentecost). Sometimes you'll see him with a book (He wrote the Book of Jude in the New Testament), other times with a tool or holding a picture of Jesus. St. Jude was a son of Clopas and his mother was the Virgin Mary's cousin. Jude traveled extensively preaching the Gospel all over. He is believed to have been martyred either in Armenia or Beirut. Following his death, St. Jude's body was brought to Rome and left in a crypt in St. Peter's Basilica. Today you can find him in the left transept of St. Peter's Basilica under the main altar of St. Joseph. He shares the tomb with the apostle Simon the Zealot. Many people came to St. Jude's grave to pray and reported powerful miracles as a result. This led to him receiving the title, "The Saint for the Hopeless and Despaired." Two Saints, St. Bridget of Sweden and St. Bernard, had visions from God asking them to accept St. Jude as "The Patron Saint of the Impossible."

"O most holy apostle, Saint Jude, faithful servant and friend of Jesus, the Church honors and invokes you universally as the patron of hopeless cases, and of things almost despaired of. Pray for me, who am so miserable. Make use, I implore you, of that particular privilege accorded to you, to bring visible and speedy help where help was almost despaired of.

Come to my assistance in this great need, that I may receive the consolation and succor of Heaven in all my necessities, tribulations, and sufferings, particularly (here make your request) and that I may praise God with you and all the elect throughout eternity." Amen.





November 1: All Saints Day


On the feast of All Saints, we honor those men and women who - whether they've been canonized or not - have led lives of heroic virtue that set an example for all Christians. The meaning of the feast is summarized in a sermon by St. Ber-



nard: "if we venerate their memory, it serves us, not them. But I tell you, when I think of them, I feel myself inflamed by a tremendous yearning. Calling the saints to mind inspires us, or rather arouses in us, above all else, a longing to enjoy their company so desirable in itself...In short, we long to be united in happiness with all the saints."

162nd Pope - Callixtus II

Born in Burgundy, he was elected pope February 8, 1119. During his pontificate an agreement was reached at Worms which recognized the pope's right to nominate bishops. He became well known



as a spokesman of a reform party within the church and a foe of the policy of the Holy Roman emperor Henry V. During the same year at the council at Reims, he excommunicated Henry V. In 1120 Callixtus II was able to enter Rome in triumph. The German princes soon forced Henry to reconcile with Callixtus, and the Concordat of Worms (1122), which terminated the Investiture Controversy. Callixtus called the First Lateran Council (1123), which ratified the Concordat of Worms, securing peace between church and empire for the next 35 years. Pope Callixtus II died on December 13, 1124.

Holy Moments Explained -

Why Do Holy **Moments Make Us** Happy?



Holy Moments release oxytocin into the bloodstream, inducing feelings of warmth, euphoria, and connection with others. Holy Moments literally produce a natural oxytocin high, and that is one of the reasons it feels so good to collaborate with God to create Holy Moments.

These three God-made hormones are so powerful that they allow us to experience joy even while suffering. This explains why even from prison, the apostle Paul wrote more about joy than any other theme. Let's face it, some Holy Moments come at great personal sacrifice. The satisfaction derived from Holy Moments can even supersede physical suffering. Women experience a similar phenomenon during childbirth.

Holy Moments also have a myriad of other positive effects on us. They boost feelings of confidence, optimism, and the general sense that our lives are moving in a positive direction. Holy Moments also liberate us from feeling helpless. Holy Moments move us from a passive state (waiting for something good to happen), to an active state (making something good happen).



40 Days for Life, a peaceful prayer vigil




