



Greetings in Christ, all!

I must begin by asking for your forgiveness. Last Sunday the priest assigned to the noon Mass did now show up. Fr. Le was away and we found a priest who agreed to pray the Mass, but he made a mistake and messed up on his calendar. I was attending to other priestly duties and wasn't aware that no priest had arrived, so in the end,



the members of our Parish Family who arrived for a noon Mass had to celebrate a communion service instead. He and I both feel terrible about this and ask your forgiveness for this error. We strive and sometimes we fail.

Okay, now on to Mass Intentions! A Mass Intention is an ancient practice within the Church whereby we offer a Mass for the soul of a person who has gone before us in death. It is one of the ways we stay connected to the Mass and to our beloved dead. Traditionally, parishes offer a schedule of days when a Mass is available for an intention and people fill in the blanks.

There are a lot of you out there, praise God, and there are only about 550 Masses a year that have openings for intentions. Obviously, Le and I pray more than those 550 (about 100 funeral and wedding Masses a year), but these Masses do not have openings for intentions.

What we are running into is a GREAT problem: so many of you faithful and wonderful people want us to pray Masses for your beloved dead, but we run into problems meeting those needs. We also do not want to run into a situation where someone (with great intentions, excuse the pun) simply grabs every available Mass.

So, we've come up with two solutions: One, a new policy that will help us balance the needs of justice within our community in making sure we are praying for as many of our beloved dead as possible.

Two, we are utilizing the resources available to us through Beautiful Fiji! We not only have an amazing priest from Fiji, but we also have connections to priests there who would welcome intentions for the Masses they pray! Basically, we are offshore outsourcing our Mass intentions (hahaha). If you are interested in finding out our new policy, please make sure to let us know at the office.

Our Catholic Heritage by Earl Hagen

58th Pope – Silverius Born in Frosinone, he was elected June 1, 536, with the support of Gothic King Theodatus. The Liber Pontificalis alleges that (sub deacon) Silverius had purchased his elevation from the King. What fol-



lowed is as tangled a web of treachery and double-dealing as can be found anywhere in the papal annals. Historian Jeffrey Richards interprets his low rank as an indication that Theodahad was eager to put a pro-Gothic candidate on the throne on the eve of the Gothic War. To accomplish this, those responsible passed over the entire diaconate as "untrustworthy." As war commenced, the Byzantine armies of Justinian under the command of Belisarius, captured Rome. The pope was then exiled to the island of Ponza where he was assassinated, having been forced to renounce the papacy. Silverius died a martyr November 11, 537.

November 3: St. Martin de Porres

Martin de Porres was born in Lima, Peru, in 1579 to parents of mixed race. Raised primarily by his mother, a freed slave, Martin experienced the effects of racism and poverty early in his life. He became the apprentice of a barber, learning not only how to cut hair, but to perform basic medical treatments. Feeling called to give his life to God in ser-



vice of the lowly, Martin entered the Dominicans, who accepted him as a lay helper and later as a brother. He spent his days caring for those who were sick and poor, as well as performing menial tasks within the monastery. His nights were spent in prayer, penance, and adoration.




