



St. Michael the Archangel



Big news this week, folks! You may remember that before I arrived here, our parish signed an agreement with the city to do certain things on our campus. One part of the plan we have to do sooner rather than later is build a new building to house our Outreach to the poor and needy and then tear down the old place that we currently do it from. On Tues-



day, November 12th, our Finance Council agreed to the financing for us to proceed.

This project will involve building a facility (pictured below) that will replace our current Outreach building, as well as the many little garages for our maintenance with one multipurpose building. This new building will house offices and storage for our ministry to the needy, as well as all of our maintenance equipment. I'm very excited about this.

When that building is completed, we will then destroy the Outreach House and the many little garages in our parking lot and gain some parking spaces.

Please note, for this to work well, we are counting on at least making our goal in the Saints and Scholars campaign. If you haven't contributed or pledged, please consider doing so soon!

Holy Family Parish has accepted the names of 353 children (136 families) from the North End Soup Kitchen for their annual Angel Tag program. Last year they had 1,200 children who received gifts from the community as a whole and they always worry about ability to respond. This is roughly 90 more than last year. Our parish said, "You can give us more. We can do it." And you've always come through.

How it works:

•Choose an angel tag (s) from the tree which will be located in the Gathering Space after Masses Saturday and Sunday, **November 23rd and 24th**. We're starting a week earlier because some



have expressed wishes to shop the Black Friday sales. If you are unable to attend Mass and wish to obtain an Angel tag, please call Nancy Repuyan at (810) 444-8896 **prior to November 23rd** and she'll give you a child's name and information. Follow the instructions in envelope.

Please return your gifts anytime **through Sunday**, **December 15th**, to the Gathering Space. We'll need Monday all day to ensure everyone is accounted for, and bag them by families. The Soup Kitchen will be coming with their truck early Tuesday morning, the 17th to pick up.

Catholic Social Teaching Collection

The Catholic Social Teaching Collection (diocesan) is to equip the faithful to understand and put into practice Catholic teaching in light of the challenges of important social issues, including the sanctity of human life, the dignity of the person, religious liberty, marriage and family, poverty, solidarity, and care for creation. Bishop Boyea has inaugurated a diocesan collection that will support small grants to applying parishes and Catholic entities within the Diocese of Lansing. This grant is designed to fund programs that combine catechesis with hands-on endeavors to advance Catholic social teaching within the diocese. Grant recipients will be selected by the Diocesan Commission on Catholic Social Teaching.

The Diocesan Catholic Social Teaching Collection supports catechetical projects which inform and inspire our practice of the Church's teaching in the world. This is distinct from the mission of Catholic Charities, which provides direct assistance to people in need. This collection is scheduled to be held annually in November.

This collection is meant to advance our understanding and building of God's kingdom: "When humanity recognizes, both in private and in public life, that Christ is King, society will at last receive the great blessings of real liberty, wellordered discipline, peace and harmony."







Our Catholic Heritage

by Earl Hagen 165th Pope - Celestine II

This pope, also known as Guido de Castellisi, was born in Citta di Castello. He was elected as Pope on October 3, 1143. A scholar of noble birth, he studied under Peter Abélard. He was made cardinal deacon in 1127 and cardinal priest in 1134. With the help of St. Bernard, he settled the internal differences of the Church. He tried to end the war between



Scotland and England, but he was not able to obtain peace in Italy. He lifted the excommunication of Louis VII of France. He was Pope for five months. Pope Celestine II died March 8, 1144.

Saint November 17: Elizabeth of Hungary

While still a young girl she was married to Louis the Landgrave of Thuringia and gave birth to three children. She devoted herself to prayer and meditation. After her husband's death, she embraced a life of poverty, erecting a hospital in which she herself served the sick. She died at Marburg in 1231.





FOLLOWING OUR FAITH

Gospel Meditation Encourage Deeper Understanding of Scripture



I recently moved into a new neighborhood. On my first evening I went grocery shopping and could not find my usual favorite Greek yogurt. Strangely, my heart started to race. All the losses of my previous life hit me. So many of my old friends, habits, comforts, and predictable experiences had fallen away. There I stood, a grown man, crying like a little boy whose world was falling apart in the dairy aisle.

This week, Jesus describes what to do when one world ends, and another begins. Does it apply to the end of time? Yes. Does it apply to the end of our individual lives? Yes. It also applies to every "world" we inhabit throughout our lives, in school, family, friendships, work, play and so on. First, the sun, moon, and stars fall. The old, familiar ways of running things suddenly stop working. Light fades. Things fall apart. It's awful. But, second, Christ comes "in **the clouds.**" Jesus, the Son of Man, replaces those old powers with himself as the prime governing principle. Third, he sends out his angels to "**gather his elect from the four winds.**" He re-integrates the fragments into a new integrated whole. "**Summer is near**," he concludes. A new world begins.

Is your world crumbling? Are your sun, moon, and stars falling from the sky? Learn to discern the pattern of the Cross and Resurrection at work in it. This is the power we touch in the Mass. Jesus is coming precisely in this transition from the old to the new world. It doesn't make our losses easy. But it does make it possible to glimpse the dawning of a summer, a new beginning, the life of the world to come.

The End of the World

"It's not the end of the world."

If I had a brick for every time my mother said this to me growing up, I could have built a castle. One that comes complete with a moat whose bridge I could dramatically pull up so I could sulk, in the window of the highest turret, sighing loudly so every passerby would know how I suffered.

Because sometimes we act like it's the end of the world whether we are a little kid angered by a playground snub, a teenage girl flipping out over an assignment for English class or a college student distraught that she got scheduled for four opening shifts in a row at the coffee house where she works (yes, these are all examples taken straight from my life, why do you ask?).

And sometimes, it really does seem like the end of the world. We lose someone we love to cancer. We miscarry a child before we even get to see his tiny face. The rent is due, and the bank account is overdrawn (also all examples taken straight from my life).

In today's Gospel, Jesus tells us that when the sun is darkened and the moon no longer gives light, we must look for him, because his time is near.

He's talking about *The End of the World*. The big one, the apocalypse. But why do I think he's also talking about the end of the world — those sufferings large and small, real and imagined, that make us feel like the sky is caving in?

In both instances, he draws near to us. So let us look for him.
