

## FIRST READING: Ezekiel 34:11-12, 15-17

Thus says the Lord GOD:

I myself will look after and tend my sheep. As a shepherd tends his flock when he finds himself among his scattered sheep, so will I tend my sheep.

I will rescue them from every place where they were scattered when it was cloudy and dark. I myself will pasture my sheep; I myself will give them rest, says the Lord GOD.

The lost I will seek out, the strayed I will bring back, the injured I will bind up, the sick I will heal, but the sleek and the strong I will destroy, shepherding them rightly.

As for you, my sheep, says the Lord GOD, I will judge between one sheep and another, between rams and goats.

### SECOND READING: 1 Corinthians 15:20-26,28

Brothers and sisters:

Christ has been raised from the dead, the firstfruits of those who have fallen asleep. For since death, came through man, the resurrection of the dead came also through man. For just as in Adam all die, so too in Christ shall all be brought to life, but each one in proper order: Christ the firstfruits; then, at his coming, those who belong to Christ; then comes the end, when he hands over the kingdom to his God and Father, when he has destroyed every sovereignty and every authority. and power. For he must reign until he has put all his enemies under his feet. The last enemy to be destroyed is death. When everything is subjected to him, then the Son himself will also be subjected to the one who subjected everything to him, so that God may be all in all.

#### GOSPEL ACCLAMATION

#### GOSPEL: Matthew 25:31-46

Jesus said to his disciples: "When the Son of Man comes in his glory, and all the angels with him, he will sit upon his glorious throne, and all the nations will be assembled before him. And he will separate them one from another, as a shepherd separates the sheep from the goats. He will place the sheep on his right and the goats on his left. Then the king will say to those on his right, 'Come, you who are blessed by my Father. Inherit the kingdom prepared for you from the foundation of the world. For I was hungry and you gave me food, I was thirsty and you gave me drink, a stranger and you welcomed me, naked and you clothed me, ill and you cared for me, in prison and you visited me.' Then the righteous will answer him and say, 'Lord, when did we see you hungry and feed you, or thirsty and give you drink? When did we see you a stranger and welcome you, or naked and clothe you? When did we see you ill or in prison, and visit you?' And the king will. say to them in reply, 'Amen, I say to you, whatever you did for one of the least brothers of mine, you did for me.' Then he will say to those on his left, 'Depart from me, you accursed, into the eternal fire prepared for the devil and his angels. For I was hungry and you gave me no food, I was thirsty and you gave me no drink, a stranger and you gave me no welcome, naked and you gave me no clothing, ill and in prison, and you did not care for me.' Then they will answer and say, 'Lord, when did we see you hungry or thirsty or a stranger or naked or ill or in prison, and not minister to your needs?' He will answer them, 'Amen, I say to you, what you did not do for one of these least ones, you did not do for me.' And these will go off to eternal punishment, but the righteous to eternal life."

## A Cup of Joe

Hello, my Holy Family! What a great week we begin when we celebrate Thanksgiving. It's a time for us not just to give lip service to the idea, but to commit ourselves to gratitude. I am convinced that choosing to be grateful is one of the most important keys to being holy and happy. Choose gratitude today!

Speaking of gratitude... Fr. Le is amazing, if you haven't noticed yet. We are just getting to know each other, but he has already "dove on the pile" as it were and begun serving. I'm excited about him being here, as it means we can serve more of you better, I hope.

I'm also grateful for the people of St. Casimir in Lansing. I hope we remember and share with our kids that part of the reason our new Church will be so lovely is because of their giving in the midst of pain. It is an amazing reflection to me that, while they were/are hurting because of the closing of their parish, they responded to that pain by reaching out to so many parishes and giving. May we all be inspired to do the same in the midst of our sorrows and hurts.

In regard to Covid, we're making some pretty big decisions here at Holy Family and I ask you to pray. Due to the rising number of Covid positive cases, the Holy Family Executive Team has made the following decisions: Holy Family parish office will be open for appointments only beginning Wednesday, November 18, through Tuesday, December 8. There will be no school on Wednesday, November 18. Holy Family School will switch to virtual learning from Thursday, November 19 - Wednesday, November 25 (half day). We plan to return to school in-person on November 30th. Holy Family Parish wants to do its part to help prevent the spread of this virus. At this time, Mass attendance will continue as normal and we will continue to livestream Masses. Our Bishop has extended dispensation until Tuesday, February 16. Please pray for our Parish family. I know we're all tired of the overreaction and underreaction to this virus and I totally get it. As your Pastor, I want to make sure I balance the responsibilities that personal freedom requires of us with the fact that a few can affect the whole by exercising their freedom.

In the end, one thing I know, and I type this with sorrow, is that we are definitely going to limit attendance at the Rededication of our Church. We're literally going to pray this Mass with just the Bishop and the essential servers and participants at Mass. I'm deeply sorry and I hate this, but I believe with all my heart we have made the right call.

I'm also grateful for some time off! Dad and I will be taking a "vacation" starting after my last Mass on November 22nd, lasting for one week. Because of Dad's age and my bad lungs, I don't think traveling is really an option for us so we'll probably just stay around here and get some work done in the rectory, while sleeping in (that's 5:30 am for

Dad!) and taking walks and such. It'll just be nice to go a week without making decisions!



Holy Family Parish has accepted the names of 200 children (60 families) from the North End Soup Kitchen as part of their annual Angel Tag program.

This is a wonderful opportunity to bring love and cheer to those most in need. It's our privilege to be able to do it.

#### How it works:

- Choose an angel tag(s) from the tree which will be located in the right corner of the large hall as you enter. Tags will be available after Masses starting with the Saturday Mass following Thanksgiving, Nov. 28th.
- Knowing not everyone is comfortable attending Mass as yet and if you wish to obtain an Angel tag, please call Nancy Repuyan at (810) 444-8896 prior to November 28th and she will give you necessary information for your child.
- Purchase your gift(s) for each child. Suggested amount is \$30-\$40 per child. Please keep in mind there may be several items requested. These are simply ideas; you do not have to purchase all items requested. Gift cards are appropriate for anyone over 15.
- Wrap your gift(s). Cut the top portion of your tag and attach it to your wrapped gift, making sure the child's first name and the code identifier is visible. This identifies the child's family and makes it easier to gather all gifts for that family in one bundle.

The tags will hang from the tree after all Masses the weekend of November 28-29th. Please prayerfully consider helping a family in need this Christmas season.

Gifts can be brought back **December 1st through 11th** to the Fr. Bush Parish Center lobby and placed in the Gift Box. The Soup Kitchen will be picking them up Tuesday, December 15th and we'll need time to determine that every child has a gift.

#### Will I still be able to watch Mass at home?

Yes! We will continue to livestream our 8 am Masses Monday Saturday and our 10 am Mass on Sunday. Our Bishop has extended the dispensation through November 28th. Elderly, people who are ill or have health issues, and children under seven years old are asked to not attend Mass.

#### What about confessions?

Drive-up reconciliation (lower lot) is scheduled Saturday, December 19, 9 am - 11 am. Fr. Tom Nenneau is hearing confessions after the 8 am Mass on Saturdays in the hall.




