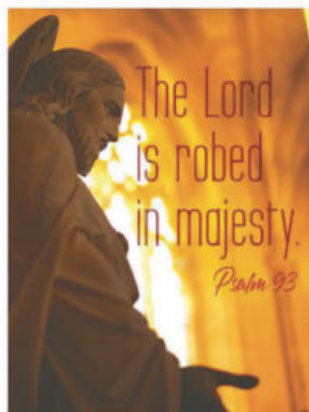

2024 Giving Tree

Holy Family Parish has accepted the names of 353 children (136 families) from the North End Soup Kitchen for their annual Angel Tag program. Last year they had 1,200 children who received gifts from the community as a whole and they always worry about ability to respond. This is roughly 90 more than last year. Our parish said, "You can give us more. We can do it." And you've always come through.

How it works:

- Choose an angel tag (s) from the tree which will be located in the Gathering Space after Masses Saturday and Sunday, **November 23rd and 24th**. We're starting a week earlier because some have expressed wishes to shop the Black Friday sales. If you are unable to attend Mass and wish to obtain an Angel tag, please call Nancy Repuyan at (810) 444-8896 **prior to November 23rd** and she'll give you a child's name and information. Follow the instructions in envelope.

Please return your gifts anytime **through Sunday, December 15th**, to the Gathering Space. We'll need Monday all day to ensure everyone is accounted for, and bag them by families. The Soup Kitchen will be coming with their truck early Tuesday morning, the 17th to pick up.

Our Catholic Heritage

166th Pope - Pope Lucius II

Born in Bologna, Italy, he was elected on March 12, 1144.

Lucius II, also known by his original name, Gherardo Caccianemici. He

was made cardinal by Pope

Callixtus II in 1123 and papal chancellor by Pope Innocent II, whom he aided against the antipope Anacletus II.

When King Roger II of Sicily invaded papal lands and forced Lucius to accept his truce, Anacletus' brother, the patrician Giordano Pierleoni, led the Romans to proclaim a constitutional republic free from papal civil rule. Lucius opposed this bid for Roman independence. While trying to prevent an extremely grave riot he was struck by a stone and died from his injuries. He was Pope for less than a year. Pope Lucius II died February 15, 1145 in Rome.



Saint

November 30: St. Andrew

Andrew was St. Peter's brother and was called with him. "As [Jesus] was walking by the Sea of Galilee, he saw two brothers, Simon who is now called Peter, and his brother Andrew, casting a net into the sea; they were fishermen. He said to them, 'Come after me, and I will make you fishers of men.' At once they left their nets and followed him" (Matthew 4:18-20). John the Evangelist presents Andrew as a disciple of John the Baptist.

When Jesus walked by one day, John said, "Behold, the Lamb of God." Andrew and another disciple followed Jesus. "Jesus turned and saw them following him and said to them, 'What are you looking for?' They said to him, 'Rabbi (which translated means Teacher), where are you staying?' He said to them, 'Come, and you will see.' So they went and saw where he was staying, and they stayed with him that day" (John 1:38-39a)

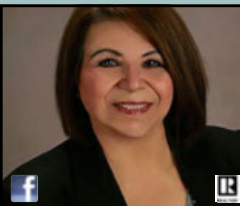

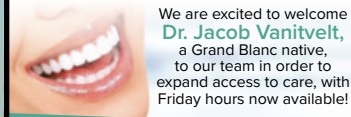
