


St. Michael the Archangel





Baby Bottles for Life





Saint

November 3: St. Martin de Porres Martin de Porres was born in Lima, Peru, in 1579 to parents of mixed race. Raised primarily by his mother, a freed slave, Martin experienced the effects of racism and poverty early in his life. He became the apprentice of



a barber, learning not only how to cut hair, but to perform basic medical treatments. Feeling called to give his life to God in service of the lowly, Martin entered the Dominicans, who accepted him as a lay helper and later as a brother. He spent his days caring for those who were sick and poor, as well as performing menial tasks within the monastery. His nights were spent in prayer, penance, and adoration.

Our Catholic Heritage

163rd Pope - Honorius II

Born in Fiagnano, he was elected on September 2, 1124. He rose from a modest background, but thanks to his outstanding capabilities and clear intelligence he quickly rose through the ranks of the church hierarchy. He renewed friendly relations with nearly all European courts in view of the fight against Saracens. During his pontificate the famous factions of the Guelphs (for the pope) and the Ghibellines (for the Emperor) came into being. He sustained Lothair of Saxony who succeeded Henry V. During his pontificate, Italy saw the rise of the Guphi faction, sustainers of the pope and the Ghibelline faction, who were sustainers of the Emperor. At the Concordat of Worms in 1122 (as a cardinal) he helped to end the investiture controversy, a conflict flourishing in the 11th and 12th centuries over whether the papacy or the Holy Roman emperor had the right to appoint the clergy. He was pope for six years. Pope Honorius II died on February 13, 1130.





Gospel Meditation

Encourage Deeper Understanding of Scripture



Americans have long been fascinated with public debates. Farmers stood in muddy fields for hours to hear Lincoln and Douglas dispute each other in the 1860 presidential run-up. The televised debate between Kennedy and Nixon in 1960 fascinated the nation. These days, cable news outlets and social media parse every word spoken by candidates. We still love seeing public, rational disputes in the service of our nation.

In his day, Jesus also captured attention as a public debater. Mark tells us, "And one of the scribes came up and heard them disputing with one another, and seeing that he answered them well, asked him, 'Which commandment is the first of all?'" Jesus' brief but all-encompassing response is the double command to love God and neighbor. Notice that he includes the importance of loving God with "all your mind." Loving God is not simply a question of affection, loyalty, good deeds, and religious dedication. It demands honest and intense intellectual engagement — just like an accomplished debater.

How do we do this practically? One simple way is by embracing ourselves as life-long learners. Setting aside time for reading, book studies, online classes, and, perhaps most difficult, engaging in open, honest, and curious conversation with those who think differently from us. These are all great ways to love God with our minds. Our country and our Church depend greatly on souls who love God in this way with their minds. Let's commit to loving God with all our minds in tireless pursuit of truth.




