


St. Michael the Archangel







Our Catholic Heritage

167th Pope - Blessed Eugene III
Pope Eugene III was the 167th pope
February 15, 1145. He is also known
as the Blessed Pope due to the miracles he performed after dying and for
the blessings he gave while alive.
Known as Bernardo from birth he was
born in 1080 in Montemagno (Pisa).
The same day Pope Lucius II died,



being hit in the head by a heavy rock, cardinals elected Bernardo as the next pope. He chose the name Pope Eugene III and began his reign outside of Rome. Problems between the Roman Senate and the clergy made the city unstable. Fearing that he might die in the same way as the previous pope, he agreed to travel to Farfa where he was consecrated. This marked the beginning of the Second Crusade, he spent several months traveling through Italy before finally making his way to France. He lived in a fortress outside of Rome and was one of the only popes to never live in Rome due to continued uprising.

Saint

December 7: St. Ambrose

Ambrose was born of a Roman family at Trier about the year 340. He studied at Rome and served in the imperial government at Sirmium. In 374, while living in Milan, he was elected bishop of the city in popular acclaim and ordained on December 7. He devotedly carried out his duties and especially distinguished himself by his service to the poor and as an effective pastor



and teacher of the faithful. He strenuously guarded the laws of the Church and defended orthodox teachings. He was also influential in the conversion of St. Augustine. St. Ambrose died on Holy Saturday in 397.



Advent Wreath Explained

The Advent wreath is a circle. Since they have no beginning and no end, the circular shape of the Advent Wreath symbolizes eternal life in Christ. The wreath holds four candles which are lit progressively, over the four weeks of the Advent season. Generally, three are violet (purple) and one is rose-colored, each representing 1,000 years. Added together, the four candles symbolize the 4,000 years that humanity waited for the Savior.

Violet is a liturgical color symbolizing penance, sacrifice, and prayer. During the first, second, and fourth weeks of Advent, we light violet candles as a reminder of the preparation of heart and mind undertaken in this season.

The Third Sunday of Advent is called Gaudete (Rejoice) Sunday. On this day we celebrate that our wait is almost over. Since rose is the liturgical color used to signify joy, we light the rose candle on the third Sunday of Advent as we rejoice in anticipation of the coming of the Messiah.

Advent wreaths were traditionally made of evergreen branches, which have long been a symbol of the constancy and faithfulness we aspire to as Christians. Evergreens flourish during every season, remaining unchanged through the harshness of winter. We are called to live our faith this same way—with holy confidence.

Holly, with its prickly leaves, represents the Crown of Thorns, and pinecones represent the Resurrection, because they contain the seeds of a new tree, and therefore of new life.


