
GOSPEL ACCLAMATION

We prayed, struggled and sacrificed and now, God has given us this magnificent place to worship Him.







Why Healing Prayer?

"Preach as you go, saying 'The kingdom of heaven is at hand.' Heal the sick, raise the dead, cleanse the lepers, cast out demons." Matthew 10:7-8

Most Catholics are used to praying for the sick. We do so at the liturgy, at special events, and in private whenever we hear of someone who is ill or injured.

But it is something else to pray *with* and *over* a sick person, confidently asking the Lord to heal him or her. That is outside the box for many Catholics. Many are not sure whether it is even legitimate to do so. Isn't it prideful to expect God to work a healing at my request? I'm not worthy to be used like that. I don't pray enough through the day, much less live up to the holiness of the saints.

This hesitation is understandable, but it is based on a serious misconception. The truth is that God pours out His gifts, including the gift of healing, freely. He desires to give this gift far more abundantly than we think. He is not limited by our abilities, but only by our faith and desire to be used by Him. "By the power at work within us [He] is able to do far more abundantly than all that we ask or think" (Eph 3:20) - Healing bringing the Gift of God's Mercy to the World -Mary Healy

Paul looked directly at him, saw that he had faith to be healed, and called out, "Stand up on your feet!" At that, the man jumped up and began to walk. - Acts 14:9-10
