




St. Michael the Archangel

Chalking the Door

20 + C + M + B + 25This year we invite you to join us in the tradition of "chalking the door" to celebrate the Epiphany. The Epiphany marks the arrival of the



magi to the place where Jesus was born and the end of Christmas. This year it will be celebrated on Sunday, January 5 (typically celebrated on January 6, the 12th day of Christmas). **Next week** envelopes with the prayer and blessed chalk will be available in the Gathering Space for you to participate at your home.

"Chalking the door" is a sign and symbol of asking God's blessing upon those who live, work, or visit throughout the coming year. In Exodus, the Israelites marked their doors with blood so that the Lord would pass over their homes; but in this service, we mark our doors with chalk as a sign inviting God's presence and blessing into our homes.

The letters C M B come from the traditional names for the three kings: Caspar, Melchior, and Balthazar. It is also an abbreviation for "Christus Mansionem Benedicat" which means, "May Christ bless this dwelling!" The first and last numbers simply refer to the current year.

Pray: Lord God of heaven and earth, you revealed your only begotten Son to every nation by the guidance of a star. Bless this house and all who live here and all who visit. May we be blessed with health, kindness of heart, gentleness and the keeping of your law. Fill us with the light of Christ, that our love for each other may go out to all. We ask this through Christ our Lord. Amen.





He was predeceased by his parents, Stan and Jeannine Owens, his sisters Kelly Owens and Renee Potrafka.

A funeral Mass was celebrated at Holy Family for **Patricia Dowling** on December 18, 2024. Patricia, age 87, died on Sunday, December 15, 2024. She was born July 10, 1937, in in Toledo, OH to James and Mary Rose Meyer. She and her husband, Joe, were married for over 56 years. Surviving are her sons Joseph Jr., Dave (Jackie), Doug (Kerry), and Dan (Susan); daughter Debby Mays; grandchildren Jamie, Josh (Erin), Riley, Connor (Shelly), Kellen, Caitlin, Carson, Morgan, Nick, Ryan, Drew, Tommy, and Jimmy; and two great-grandchildren, Miles and Jordan. She is also survived by her sister Mary Helen (Doug) Berry and many nieces and nephews. She was predeceased by parents, her sister Judy, her husband Joe, granddaughter Ellen Patricia Mays, daughter-in-law Nancy Dowling, and son-in-law Kirk Mays.

FOLLOWING OUR FAITH

Our Catholic Heritage by Earl Hagen

171st - Pope Lucius III Born in Lucca, Tuscany, around 1097, Pope Lucius III, birth name was Ubaldo Allucingoli. Experts believe he was a member of the wealthy Allucingoli family. He was installed as Pope on September 1, 1181. His pa-




pacy was marked by significant challenges and conflicts that forced him to spend most of his reign in exile. Pope Lucius III refused to comply with the wishes of King Frederick I in many different situations. This conflict led to the pope refusing to crown Henry of Hohenstaufen as King Frederick I's successor. The dispute between the church and Italian politics grew even wider. The pope organized the synod at Verona, which was held in November 1184. While most of the meeting involved the condemnation of different heretic groups, including the Cathars and Paterines, Waldensians, Josephines, Pasagians and Arnoldists, another outcome of this meeting was the recognition of matrimony as a holy sacrament. Pope Lucius III was one of the last popes to believe that it was acceptable for clergy to be married. At age 41, in May 1141, he was first assigned as Cardinal-deacon, then within the same year, named Cardinal-Priest of Santa Prassede. In December 1158 at age 58.9, he was appointed as Cardinal-Bishop of Ostia (e Velletri), then in 1159 at age 59, he was ordained Bishop as Cardinal-Bishop of Ostia (e Velletri). His papacy, lasted four years and 85 days. Pope Lucius III died, November 25, 1185, at age 85 from unspecified causes. He was one of the oldest popes to have served.

Saint

December 29: St. Thomas Becket Thomas Becket was the Archbishop of Canterbury who was murdered in the cathedral on this day in 1170. Thomas was an archdeacon when King Henry II appointed him chan-



cellor, and they had a good relationship. But when he became archbishop, his personality changed and became more ascetical. His relationship with the king also deteriorated. When a conflict arose over the matter between Church and state, he refused to sign the document which severely limited the rights of the Church. He was abandoned by the bishops who wanted to maintain good relations with the king. After returning from six years in exile in France, certain people whom he had angered arranged to have him killed by four knights. Although the clergy wanted to barricade the doors of the cathedral, Becket refused, saying: "I am ready to die for the name of Jesus and the defense of the Church." He was struck down at the altar of the Blessed Virgin and St. Benedict. As a result of his death, both the king of England and the king of France were reconciled with the Church.

Holy Moments Explained -

WHAT GIVES YOU HOPE?

There are a growing number of people who have lost hope in our society. Devastated by cruelty and injustice, having suffered in so many ways, they have lost faith themselves, in humanity, in God, and in society. Just like Jean Valjean they need the tender touch of a Holy Moment.

What is the difference between when we are hopeful and hopeless? When we are hopeful, we believe the future can be better than the past and that there are things we can do to help bring about that better future. Hope empowers us.

When we lose hope, we stop believing that the future can be better, and start believing that there is nothing we can do about our situation. This victim mindset takes us deeper into the hopelessness, which makes us feel that even the smallest things are impossible.

Holy Moments remind us that the future can be better than the past. They fill us with hope. They show us that we have a vital role to play in bringing about that better future. Holy Moments empower us to give others the gift of hope, and the ability to give other people hope is profoundly beautiful.

Anything that can bring people hope is of infinite value. Holy Moments are such a thing.


