

I hope you don't mind, but I asked them to give them to us to see what we can do. So, our tree is full again. If you are able to help or to help more, please don't hesitate to do so.


I'm so touched by your care for those in need. Thank you for the honor of being a priest for people like you.

**Please** be sure that any donated foods are not beyond their expiration date. We are not able to share them.


### WHAT'S HAPPENING HERE



#### **Our Catholic Heritage**

115th Pope - Theodore II

Born in Rome, he was elected pope in December 897. The favored candidate of the Germanic groups, he governed the church for 20 days. His short reign occurred during a period of partisan strife in the Catholic Church, caused by the "Cadaver Synod" which was entangled with a period of violence and disorder in central Italy. During this time he had the body of Pope Formosus recovered from the Tiber and properly buried in the Vatican. He called back and reinstalled all of the bishops and clergymen that had been exiled. There was a suspicion of poisoning or assassination in his sudden and unexpected death. Pope Theodore II died in December 897 and is buried in the Vatican grottoes

#### No Neighbor Left Behind

Join us in putting our faith in action leaving No Neighbor Left Behind!

- In November the Knights helped 72 families and eight different outreaches/organizations/pregnancy centers, providing more than 740 household items. We provide families in need with furniture, appliances, pots, pans and dishes. We deliver clothes, food and special requests to Holy Family and other area outreaches.
- So far in 2023, we have helped 343 families, delivering 3,577 items and delivering another 1,298 items to 18 outreaches/organizations.
- Thank you to Holy Family Outreach and all who help with donations, pickups and deliveries.
- Special thanks to all those who have donated to our fundraiser to purchase a high-roof van, which will allow us to deliver beds in the rain. We have received over 29% of our goal! See Desiree Londrigan, Al Gaulin or call Joe Buffa at (313) 718-0714 if you would like to donate.
- We have 116 families waiting for us to find/deliver items for them. We especially need beds, dressers, appliances, and kitchen tables, in addition to silverware, pots and pans. We cannot deliver what we have

in storage fast enough, so if you can help deliver to a family, it would be a blessing to them.





December 3: St. Francis Xavier
Francis made the spiritual exercises under the direction of St.
Ignatius, and in 1534 joined his
little community, the newly formed
Society of Jesus. Together at
Montmartre they vowed poverty,
chastity, and apostolic service
according to the directions of the
pope. From Venice, where he was
ordained a priest in 1537, Francis



Xavier went on to Lisbon and from there sailed to the East Indies, landing at Goa, on the west coast of India. For the next ten years he labored to bring the faith to such widely scattered peoples as the Hindus, the Malayans, and the Japanese. He spent much of that time in India, and served as provincial of the newly established Jesuit province of India. Francis went through the islands of Malaysia, then up to Japan. He learned enough Japanese to preach to simple folk, to instruct, and to baptize, and to establish missions for those who were to follow him. From Japan he had dreams of going to China, but this plan was never realized.

#### **Noon Mass Ushers**



#### **Eucharistic Adoration "Adorers" Needed**

Every Tuesday and Friday, we expose the Blessed Sacrament for time of Eucharistic Adoration. This is a wonderful time for private prayer and personal communion with the Lord.






