

May Jesus bless you all. I thank Him every day that I get to be your priest.







The Soup Kitchen will be coming with their truck early Tuesday morning, the 17th to pick up.



What gives you hope?

Valjean repays this generous hospitality by stealing his host's silverware. The police capture him the next day and bring him back to return the silverware. But Valjean's host protects his thieving guest, telling the police that the silverware was a gift. This act of kindness, this Holy Moment, sets Valjean free in every way imaginable.

Jean Valjean's host was an elderly bishop, a true man of God. He knew Holy Moments had the power to ransom people from fear and hatred and return them to God.

This encounter with the bishop was the first time in decades Valjean had been treated with love, respect, and compassion. It forever changes him.


It was a moment of tender care. The bishop did not see Valjean as a thief and did not see himself as a bishop. He saw only two brothers. In that moment nothing else mattered to him except what was best for Jean Valjean. It was indeed a Holy Moment.

168th Pope - Pope Anastasius IVPope Anastasius IV, born Corrado
Demetri della Suburra, began serving as the head of the Catholic
Church on July 12, 1153. Corrado
(Anastasius) born in Rome circa
1073, and was appointed the cardinal deacon 54 years later of a



church in Sabina in December of 1127. His father was instrumental in helping him become a clerk for the Church before he became a cardinal deacon. His name came up in previous papal elections, however, it wasn't until 1153 that he was finally called as the next pope taking the name Anastasius IV. Anastasius IV developed a strong reputation as a peacemaker during his short time as a pope. Anastasius IV's short papacy, almost a year and 5 months was marked by diplomatic skill and efforts to maintain peace. He was known for his experience, generosity, and attempts to reconcile conflicts within the Church, particularly regarding appointments of clergy in England. Historians believe he was one of the oldest men (around 80 years old) to ever serve as pope. Pope Anastasius IV was buried in a sarcophagus that is now in the Vatican Museum in Vatican City. Pope Anastasius IV died of natural causes on December 3, 1154.

Saint December 14: St. John of the Cross

John of the Cross was born at Fountiveros in Spain around 1542. After a number of years as a Carmelite, he was persuaded by Saint Teresa of Avila in 1568 to lead a reform movement among the brothers which



brought a new energy to the Carmelite Order. Renowned for his wisdom and sanity, he died in Ubeda in 1591. His spiritual writings remain a fitting testimony to his life.

Our needs are great and our people thirst for your presence.




