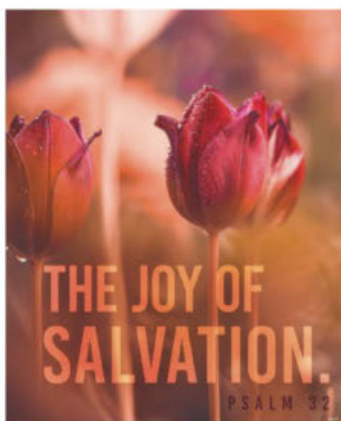

Greetings in Christ, all!

I simply can't believe I am typing these words, but Lent is upon us! This Wednesday is Ash Wednesday, the beginning of our Lenten Season.

Every year we tend to choose a theme for our preaching during Lent and this year is no different. After prayer and discussion, we felt called to focus on an older tradition of preaching "The Last Seven Words of Christ."

I'd like to break that down a little for you. Our four Gospel accounts of Jesus have him saying seven different statements while on the cross, thus the phrase "The Seven Last Words of Christ."

During Lent we have a schedule of which phrase we will preach on. This is what it will look like:

Feb 18 - "My God, my God, why hast thou forsaken me?"

Feb 25 - "Truly, I say to you, today you will be with me in Paradise."

March 3 - "Woman, behold your son. Son, behold your mother!"

March 10 - "I Thirst"

March 17 - "Father, into thy hands I commit my spirit!"

March 24 - "It is finished"

Each homily will look at what Jesus said and what challenge, blessing or insights those words offer us.

During this Lenten Season, make sure we are "upping our game" and giving God our all, challenging ourselves to never be content with where we are in our relationship with Jesus. Let's ask for the grace to pray and sacrifice like never before, entering into the suffering and death of Jesus, so that we can enter His resurrection with Him.

I look forward to God blessing us all deeply in this wonderful season!

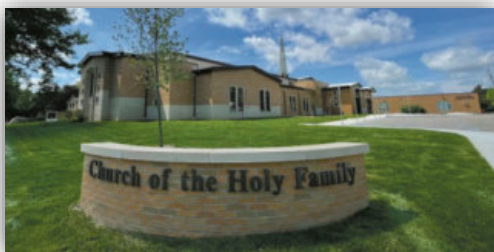

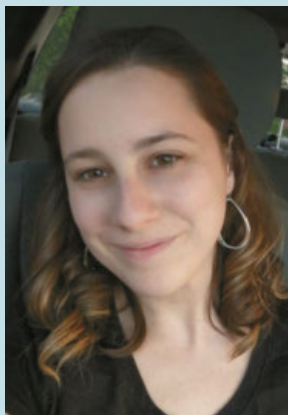

Our Catholic Heritage

125th Pope - John XI

Born in Rome. His mother Marozia, dominant lady of the Roman Crescentii family, had her son elected as pope in March 931. This was the same son who was reputedly the illegitimate son of Sergius III. He tried to settle the serious intrigues of his family, but he deplored their lack of restraint. After being widowed by Guido of Tuscany, Marozia married his brother Hugo, King of Italy, who was just as corrupt and ambitious as she was. Together, with the consensus of John XI, they became the tyranny of Rome. Pope John XI was sent to prison where he died December 935 at the age of 29, and is buried in St. John's in Lateran.

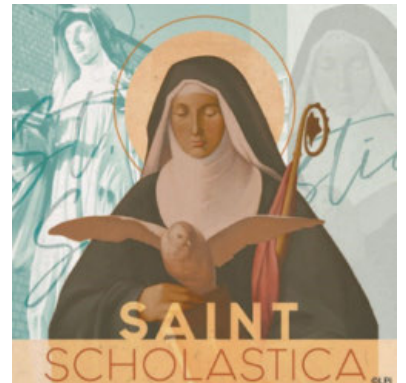

February 10: St. Scholastica

Little is known of Scholastica's early life. She founded a
religious community for women near Monte Cassino at
Plombariola, five miles from where her brother governed a
monastery. Scholastica was the twin sister of St. Benedict.
According to the Dialogues of St. Gregory the Great, the
brother and sister spent their last day together in prayer
and conversation. Scholastica sensed her death was
close at hand and she begged Benedict to stay with her
until the next day. He refused her request because he did
not want to spend a night outside the monastery, thus
breaking his own Rule. Scholastica asked God to let her
brother remain and a
severe thunderstorm
broke out, preventing
Benedict and his monks
from returning to the
abbey. Benedict cried
out, "God forgive you,
Sister. What have you
done?" Scholastica re-
plied, "I asked a favor of
you and you refused. I
asked it of God and he
granted it."

Is God Calling You to Join the Secular Franciscan Order?



The "Secular Franciscan Order," once known as the Third Order of St. Francis of Assisi, is an official order within the Catholic Church. It was established by St. Francis of Assisi in the 13th Century for men and women living in the world to follow the Gospel Life in the footsteps of St. Francis.

We are lay men and women, Diocesan priests and deacons who, after a period of discernment, make a promise, to follow a Rule of Life approved by Pope Paul VI in 1978.

We are Catholics, single or married - mothers, fathers, sisters, brothers, sons and daughters. We pray, study, and strive to experience ongoing daily conversion by being faithful to the Gospel.

We strive to achieve "perfect charity" using our talents and resources to help the poor, the oppressed, and outcast and the helpless. We hope to achieve "Justice, Peace, and the Integrity of all Creation."



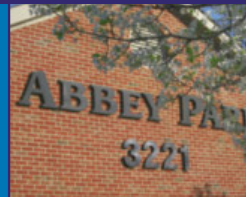

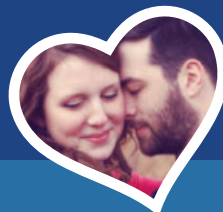
