

Any help you can offer on this will be so greatly appreciated.



Our Catholic Heritage

176th - Pope Innocent III

Born on February 22, 1161 in Anagni, known at birth as Lotario dei Conti di Segni (Lothar of Segni). On February 21, 1198, at age 37, he became a priest. A day later the new pope. Immedi-



ately he began dealing with problems. The Western Emperor Henry VI had died leaving two rivals for the throne. There was growing heresy in the south of France. The Christian principalities of the Holy Land had fallen to the Muslims, and southern Italy had collapsed into disarray. The pope's authority collapsed in Rome and other Papal States. He began sending out crusades to Muslim held Spain and the Holy Land. As well dispatched the Albigensian Crusade to fight the heresy of the Cathars in the south of France. He organized the Fourth Crusade, intended for Jerusalem in hopes to reunite the Eastern and Western churches. Instead Constantinople was attacked and captured. Enraged at the assault on Constantinople, Innocent III excommunicated all participating Crusaders. It has been called one of the great failures of his pontificate leaving bitter hostility between the Greek and Catholic churches that only grew worse. He is regarded as the most important pope from the medieval period. His legacy still impacts the papacy today. Quoted as saying: "Anyone who attempts to construe a personal view of God which conflicts with Church dogma must be burned without pity." Pope Innocent III died of natural causes at age 55 ending his papacy on July 16, 1216.

THE PROGRESS DELUSION

Social media is another example. It has been directly linked to anxiety and depression caused by isolation. This is the exact opposite of what it claims to do. It claims to improve the relationships when in fact it destroys them and dehumanizes people in the process.

Just like a gambling addict, we exaggerate our wins and ignore our losses in our so-called quest for progress.

We hail our latest technological advancement as an unqualified success, but there are uncomfortable truths that confront our claims of progress. One billion people on our plant are chronically hungry. This is the sanitized term we use to avoid saying they are starving to death. Two billion people don't have safe drinking water in their homes. Twenty people are the victims of domestic violence every minute. One in three of our daughters and sons are sexually assaulted by the age of thirty. Someone is murdered every minute. And all of this before we consider the ravages of war and environmental degradation.

February 6: St. Paul Miki and Companions

Brother Paul Miki, a Jesuit and a native of Japan, has become the best known



among the martyrs of Japan. While hanging upon a cross, Paul Miki preached to the people gathered for the execution: "The sentence of judgment says these men came to Japan from the Philippines, but I did not come from any other country. I am a true Japanese. The only reason for my being killed is that I have taught the doctrine of Christ. I certainly did teach the doctrine of Christ. I thank God it is for this reason I die. I believe that I am telling only the truth before I die. I know you believe me and I want to say to you all once again: Ask Christ to help you to become happy. I obey Christ. After Christ's example I forgive my persecutors. I do not hate them. I ask God to have pity on all, and I hope my blood will fall on my fellow men as a fruitful rain."
