Excerpts from God in the Diary of Saint Sister Maria Faustina (Diary, 1599)



"My daughter, do not pay so much

attention to the vessel of grace as to the grace itself which I give you, because you are not always pleased with the vessel, and then the graces, too, become deficient. I want to guard you from that, and I want you never to pay attention to the vessel in which I send you My grace. Let all the attention of your soul be concentrated on responding to My grace as faithfully as possible."

Our Catholic Heritage

by Earl Hagen **179th Pope Celestine IV (1241)** He was born in Milan, circa 1180, possibly as late as 1187, in Italy. His birth name was Goffredo Castiglioni. He became pope on October 25, 1241, somewhere between age 54 and 61. Celestine IV had one of the shortest papacies in history, lasting only 16 days, never having had a cor-



onation ceremony due to his entrapment in the city, the cardinals never had the chance to hold a coronation for him.

Celestine IV was upset over the conditions surrounding his election and with the disputes between the cardinals and Frederick II. The stress he experienced, combined with his poor health, led to him dying a few weeks after becoming pope. Following his death, Roman Emperor Frederick II imprisoned the cardinals responsible for electing the next pope. It took more than 20 months before the Church appointed the next pope.

Pope Celestine IV died from natural causes in Rome on November 10, 1241.

Holy Moments Explained -

THE PROGRESS DELUSION

The culture's aggression toward morality and dismissal of anything spiritual will be the major obstacles to progress in society from this moment onward. A people confused about the difference between right and wrong, good and bad, just and unjust, will grasp at anything that promises progress and find themselves bouncing from one oblivion to another.

Determining what will cause a society to flourish begins with acknowledging what causes an individual human being to flourish.

Our lives only genuinely improve when we grow in virtue. The virtue of patience improves our lives. It improves our relationships. Two patient people will always have a better relationship than to impatient people. The same is true for generosity, perseverance, compassion, humility, and courage. Growing in virtue leads to the personal and spiritual expansion that are the hallmarks of human flourishing.

Saint

February 23: St. Polycarp Polycarp, bishop of Smyrna, disciple of Saint John the Apostle and friend of Saint Ignatius of Antioch, was a revered Christian leader during the first half of the second century. Saint Ignatius, on his way to Rome to be martyred, visited Polycarp at Smyrna. and later at Troas wrote him a personal letter. The Asia Minor Churches recognized Polycarp's leadership by choosing him as a representative to discuss with Pope Anicetus the date of the Easter celebration in Rome-a major controversy in the early Church. Only one of the many

letters written by Polycarp has been preserved, the one he wrote to the Church of Philippi in Macedonia. At 86, Polycarp was led into the crowded Smyrna stadium to be burned alive. The flames did not harm him and he was finally killed by a dagger.






