


A Cup of Joe

Welcome Back HFS!



With the first official week of school behind us, students and staff are settling in nicely to what is sure to be a great year! A lot of necessary updates were made over the summer as a result of our auction. We are blessed! Last's year's auction totals brought \$104,000 of aid to our school. The distribution of these funds are as listed below:

"Fund the Need" was for a much needed library renovation that raised \$34,000. The renovation began in June and is still in process. Painting, electrical needs, shelving, study carousels, shelving and a new circulation desk are welcome changes. Please stop in and see our updates!

The rest of the funds raised were distributed as follows:

\$40,000 for curriculum – This year our Science programs have been updated to meet the needs of today's science standards, which includes new online books, interactive notebooks and supplies for the more hands-on, collaborative experiences, that are in an integrated environment rooted in inquiry and discovery.

\$10,000 for our Band Program to assist in support of rental fees for instruments, new sheet music and instrument upkeep.

\$10,000 to provide bus transportation for all of our students when learning takes them outside of the school classrooms.

\$10,000 provided lockers to be installed in the Fourth Grade classrooms and additional cafeteria tables. Also during this summer, the installation of air conditioners to all of our classrooms has been completed!

Fr. Bush Student Scholarship

We thank you for the generous donations that have been given throughout the year to Holy Family School through the blue church offering envelopes labeled "School Support". Along with tuition and other funds, these donations are directly deposited into our general fund to pay for the basic needs of our school. Should you choose to donate through the blue "School Support" envelope in the month of September, your donation will directly benefit the Fr. Bush Student Scholarship.

This scholarship named after Fr. Bush, the founder of our church and school, will be awarded annually to a student K-8th grade. The Fr. Bush Student Scholarship recipient for the 2018-2019 school year is seventh grader, Chaeli D. Congratulations, Chaeli! 

Donation toward St. Cecilia Scholarship for Young Parish Musicians

(high school and older)

If you are willing to donate (or pledge) toward the funding of youth music scholarships, especially St. Cecilia Scholarship, you may do so at any time either by writing a check or through the parish online giving system. When you write a check, please make it payable to "Holy Family Church" with "St. Cecilia Scholarship," your planned full donation amount - even if this is a partial payment (as in payment #1 of \$50 total, or \$50 full payment), and your membership/envelope number (if applicable) in the memo line of the check. Your check may be dropped off through the collection at Mass, mailed to: Holy Family, 11804 S. Saginaw Street, Grand Blanc, MI 48439, or personally dropped off at the parish office.

If you choose to use online giving, you need to sign in to your online giving account (already established) from the Holy Family App or Holy Family website (www.hfgb.org) and select 'Give a New Gift' and then 'Music Ministry.' Under Gift Type select 'one-time' and enter the amount that you would like to donate at this time. Enter the date you want the payment taken from your account and which account to use. Please indicate in the 'Special Intentions' box which music scholarship you are donating toward (i.e., St. Cecilia Scholarship donation, Adult Choir Scholarship donation.) If this is the first payment you wish to make of a greater amount, please indicate the full amount you plan to donate (as in payment 1 of \$50 total), full payment, or payment 3 of \$100 total, etc.) This way we can know the total amount of donations planned to fund our scholarships. Any subsequent payments will have to be made individually online when you desire them to be made or you may set up subsequent payments separately to be collected on preselected future dates.
