Representatives from Catholic Bethlehem Christian Families will be with us on **Sunday, November 4, 2018**, (in the Fr. Bush Parish Center - large hall during Coffee and Donuts) to ask for your help and blessing for the native peo-

ple of the Holy Land in Bethlehem. These families, sixty years ago, made up 18% of the population. Due to recent events in the Middle East, it has caused these families to face devastating economical strain, and caused the population to decrease to less



than 2% in the Holy Land. These families have relied on the income from their religious hand-carved olive wood artifacts to tourists.

So we have come to the USA to try to help support these families by bringing their artifacts here to sell in the USA. All the proceeds from sales will be sent back to the families of the Holy Land so that they may be able to keep their homes and provide for their families. The last few years were very tough for the Christian families, and this is the only source of income for them.
