

Greetings in Christ! I pray that God bless our fall season with great joy and lots of hot chocolate...

This weekend the Church asks us to look at the idea of stewardship: sacrificing for the good of our parish family. Our bulletin this week contains financial information (pgs.

11/12) and I want to thank you all for your generous giving to our Parish: It really is impossible for us to get God's work done without your sacrifice and I want you to know I take your gifts very, very seriously.

We finished the last fiscal year with a small surplus, our family count is up, our October Mass count is up and we've seen a 4% increase in your giving for this last year. Beyond that, we found that we made a bit of



a profit from hosting an entertainment tent at the Grand Blanc festival last year, thanks to so many of you generously volunteering to work it....wow!

We were able to get a lot done because of you: we installed AC in all our classrooms, finished the library renovations with money from last spring's auction, made a lot of progress in the St. Joe hall and even got some work done on our Sound System.

In terms of the future, we've got our big *Restoring the Temple* campaign and we're praying really hard for that. I am really blessed to be at two parish families that "get it" when it comes to giving; your generosity makes it possible for us to serve as best we can.

If you are wondering about ways to help, I've obviously got ideas there: PRAY! That's always the first thing. Beyond praying, please consider giving to the parish if you do not currently do so. That makes a big difference. You can remember us in your wills, volunteer for any number of things that go on in our parish and check out our school website to see if there is a way to help there that appeals to you.

Online giving is super easy and the more of us that sign up for that, the better. If you haven't considered that, please do.

I'm sure there are more ways to help, but that is what comes to mind.

Renovation Question: A parishioner asked about possible utility/energy savings that could result from the renovation. The building renovation will certainly create a more efficient building with better thermal insulation and will provide more efficient HVAC and lighting systems, but a study projecting utility savings has not been completed. The renovation will result in a larger building, but new zoning/control technology is expected to offset much of the cost of increase in utility usage.

If you would like to volunteer for this wonderful ministry, please contact the parish office at 694-4891. This will be the best hour of your day. Let Him transform you.



As you see on the chart, 79% of our income is a result of Offertory Collections and School Income. School income includes tuition, fees, cafeteria and extended care services. Fundraising is the next largest source of income and that is primarily driven by our school through the annual Panther Draw and Auction events, as well as SCRIP gift card sales. Bequests and Donations made up 6% of our total income for the fiscal year. Finally, Other Income is 4% of the total and consists of rental income, investment income, bulletin income, recycling rebates and income from various parish groups.

Many of our parishioners use the traditional envelopes to make their contributions. The parish does pay for creating and mailing these envelopes each month. A second option that some of our parishioners choose is Online Giving, (OLG). This option can be used with credit or debit cards or your checking account and allows automatic payments to the parish. The payments can be set up in any amount and on any schedule that you desire. The payments can be updated at any time by the donor. To sign up for OLG, please visit our website https://hfgb.org/ and click on the Online Giving link at the bottom of the page.



Salaries and benefits are the major portion of our expenses at 61%. Other expense is 22% and consists primarily of contracted services, fundraising expenses, insurance, food for the cafeteria and hall, remodeling and improvements, financial aid for schools and support for school. The remaining costs are split between maintenance 6%, supplies and utilities both at 4% and the Diocesan Assessment at 3%. Diocesan Assessments are a charge to each parish from the Diocese for providing certain diocesan services that assist with running of the parish and contributes to the Priest Pension Fund.

Overall, the parish was able to reduce our expenses by 2.5% from the 2016/2017 fiscal year and increase revenue by 3.9%. This allowed us to finish 2017/2018 slightly better than our budget.

As we look to the future for ways to ensure the financial stability of the parish, please consider Holy Family Church and School in your estate planning. While it was common practice for people to leave money to the Catholic Church or School when they passed, many people now forget to include their parish or school in their final directives. Please prayerfully consider supporting Holy Family Church and School as a final act of charity.
