

A Cup of Joe

Greetings in Christ, all!

With this Sunday we enter more fully into what the Church calls "Ordinary Time." Every year I'll explain this, just because what the Church means by "Ordinary" is totally different from what we English speakers mean by it.



For us, Ordinary refers to "Plain" or some kind of predictability.

The Church is using the Latin word Ordinary, which refers to a progression of numbers. So, when the Church says we are in "ordinary time," they are referring to a liturgical season that is defined by the progression of weeks: Second Week of Ordinary Time, Third week, etc. All of this will lead us up to Lent, which is in the first week of March.

After the Lenten Season we'll have the Easter Season, followed by Pentecost, followed by more weeks of Ordinary Time, until Advent. So, we who have the honor and privilege of gathering and praying together, hearing God's Word and receiving the Blessed Sacrament, understand that there is nothing ordinary about it and we let God fill our hearts with Awe, Joy and Wonder every time we get to pray the Mass!

For my St. Mark family, I had some questions about Fr. Dave moving in from Brighton. He'll be moving in probably in July of this year. What his role will be has not yet been defined. So far, he has expressed a desire to have a community to pray with and such, but not to serve as Pastor: I think this is every priest's dream! So, obviously, I am happy to accommodate him in any way he wishes. I just feel so blessed that he will be here. As we figure this out, I'll let you know.

For my Holy Family family (that's funny to type), a minor campaign update. Obviously, we will not be able to do everything we had hoped on the plan we shared, because we were not able to hit our goal, but I am filled with gratitude and joy for your exceedingly generous response to the campaign and can't wait to get after it. I've gotten a lot of questions about what the next steps are and I have begun by meeting with our architect and construction manager to best understand our options and prepare to meet with our building committee. We'll meet with the building committee this week to figure out a plan and then get after it.

Many of you have shared frustration with me about past attempts to do something to our Church and I give you my word that we will commence with an overhaul that addresses our many needs and our structural issues with great respect to the generosity of your donations and pledges. Pray that I am wise and listen to the Lord. Pray for the wonderful people working on this and the building committee who have put so much time and effort into this labor of love.

For both of my Parish Families, I love you and I thank God for the wonder of being your priest. Don't forget that on February 25th, we celebrate the Conversion of St. Paul: one of the most important moments in our Christian history. It's a good day to remember that anything is possible because of our God!

Okay...so I think that is it.

The over 56 million abortions since the 1973 decisions of Roe v. Wade and Doe v. Bolton reflect with heartbreaking magnitude what Pope Francis means by a "throwaway culture." However, we have great trust in God's providence. We are reminded time and again in Scripture to seek the Lord's help, and as people of faith, we believe that our prayers are heard.

The General Instruction of the Roman Missal (GIRM), no. 373, designates January 22 as a particular day of prayer and penance, called the "Day of Prayer for the Legal Protection of Unborn Children:" "In all the Dioceses of the United States of America, January 22 shall be observed as a particular day of prayer for the full restoration of the legal guarantee of the right to life and of penance for violations to the dignity of the human person committed through acts of abortion."

As individuals, we are called to observe this day through the penitential practices of prayer, fasting and/or giving alms. Holy Family will be offering a Holy Hour on Tuesday, for reparation and healing. We will expose the Blessed Sacrament, hear from Sacred Scripture, and have time for silent prayer. We will conclude with Benediction at 1:00 pm.

We hope you are able to join us in body or spirit on this day of prayer.

A great prayer for life is urgently needed, a prayer which will rise up throughout the world. Through special initiatives and in daily prayer, may an impassioned plea rise to God, the Creator and lover of life, from every Christian community, from every group and association, from every family and from the heart of every believer.



The Parish Youth Choir will continue singing at Sunday 12 noon Mass throughout the year.





Gospel Meditation

Encourage Deeper Understanding of Scripture When you think of being Catholic, what do you think of? Perhaps you grew up with your only associations being fasting, nuns with rulers, and "Catholic guilt." Our faith can sometimes have the connotation of restriction and absence, not abundance. Who is God in your life? Is He the divine law-giver, the judge punishing the rule-breakers? These are certainly attributes of God. But the laws don't exist for themselves alone. They exist to help us love one another as God loves us. And this loving God is the author of abundance and joy.

Did you hear today's Gospel? "There was a wedding at Cana in Galilee." Here at this wedding, Jesus would perform "the beginning of his signs...and so reveal his glory." This first sign isn't a miraculous healing. He didn't raise someone from the dead. He kept a party going! "There were six stone water jars there for Jewish ceremonial washings, each holding twenty to thirty gallons...the water...had become wine." The wine has run out. Jesus creates somewhere between 120 and 180 gallons to help his friend save face. We may not have such momentous miracles in our lives, but God is watching out for us. The string of green lights when you're running late. The sale on the replacement appliance you need. The friend who calls at just the right time. These are the little moments of God's abundance. We just need to look for them!

Not only does Jesus surprise, but the guests point out to their host: "You have kept the good wine until now." The divine wine is better than the earthly variety. God's goodness is better than what we can grasp at for ourselves. Isn't that how it always goes?


