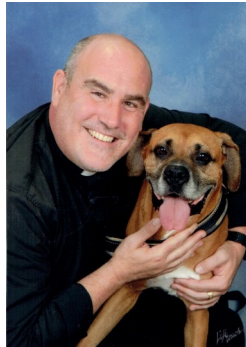

A couple business things in regard to our coming construction:

The work of preparing the hall for Mass there is going really well. We've got the new ceiling tiles ordered and the sound system is coming together. We will have a dignified and nice place to pray while we await our new Church. One of the consequenc-

es of the necessary work in our hall is going to inconvenience us a bit: The Father Bush Parish Center will be closed July 22nd to August 26, which means we won't have coffee and donuts after Mass during that time. :(

Beyond that, we are going to be asking for a lot of volunteer help moving out of our Church: people to help us move things and all sorts of details. We are also looking for volunteers to help with renovating the large hall (see article on page 4). The more that can help, the better. Please be sure to keep your eyes open for other upcoming opportunities in the bulletin.

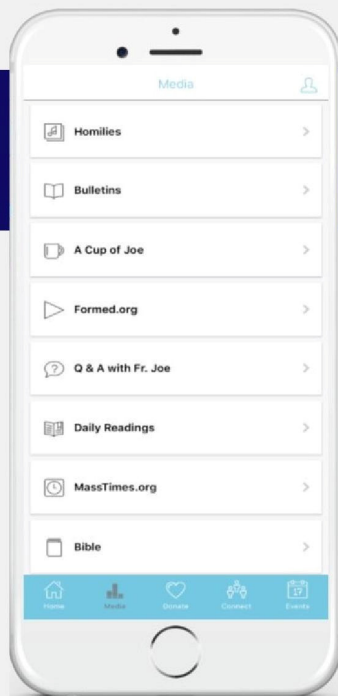

Holy Land Crafts

Representatives from Catholic Bethlehem Christian Families will be with us on the weekend of **August 3/4**, to ask for your help and blessing for the native people of the Holy Land in Bethlehem. These families, sixty years ago, made up 18% of the population. Due to recent events in the Middle East, it has caused these families to face devastating economical strain, and caused the population to decrease to less than 2% in the Holy Land. These families have relied on the income from their religious hand-carved olive wood artifacts to tourists. So we have come to the USA to try to help support these families by bringing their artifacts here to sell in the USA. All the proceeds from sales will be sent back to the families of the Holy Land so that they may be able to keep their homes and provide for their families. The last few years were very tough for the Christian families and this is the only source of income for them.

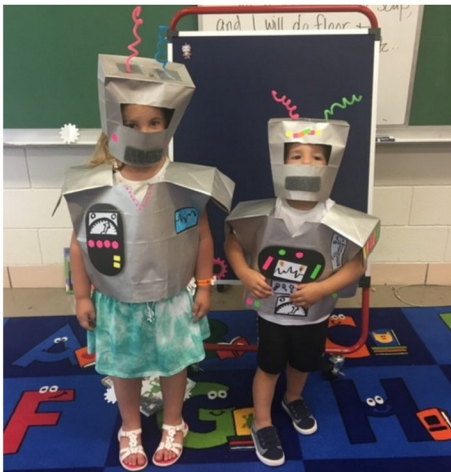

Gospel Meditation

Encourage Deeper Understanding of Scripture

Loving isn't too difficult, right? Many of us are surrounded by kind, lovely people trying to do the right thing. Indeed, to "love your neighbor as yourself" seems like it should be easy enough. Treat people like you would like to be treated. Bring the new neighbors some baked goods (normal and gluten-free, just in case). Chat with the bank teller about his holiday weekend. Write an occasional card to your sister "just because." There were probably varieties of these acts of kindness in Jesus' day. Perhaps substituting figs for cookies. But "exchange pleasantries with the traveling cloth merchant" isn't the example Jesus gives.

"A man fell victim to robbers... they stripped him and beat him and went off leaving him half-dead." The righteous pass by the scene of the dying man. The hero of the story is the one on the margins of Jewish society, who perhaps would not have been welcomed, in other circumstances, by the man now in the ditch. His neighborly love causes him to halt his journey, to tend wounds, and to pay for the man's care out of his own savings. Are we interruptible? Are we attentive to the hurts of others? Are we generous with our money and possessions?

In the past few weeks, who has crossed your mind as someone in need of help? Perhaps it's an acquaintance suffering from cancer. Maybe you were invited to donate or volunteer to a local social cause, but it just won't stick in your mind (or schedule) to make it happen. The needs of people are many and varied. We can't help everyone, but God does place opportunities in our path for compassion and courageous love. This week, be "the one who treated him with mercy."

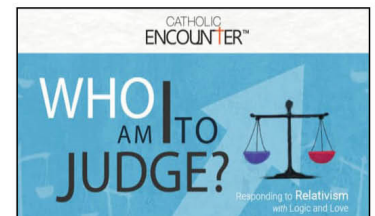
