



When we teach children that choices have consequences, the emphasis is usually placed on the consequences of poor choices, while powerful and positive consequences of wise choices are often overlooked.

Holy Moments are choices with powerful and positive consequences. Holy Moments are choices that are easy to live with.

It's time to start filling our lives with Holy Moments. If you glance back at your life, the choices you find hardest to live with were unholy moments. And the choices you find easiest to live with, the ones you are rightly proud of, those you cherish, they each held the seed of goodness. They were Holy Moments.

March 20: St. Salvator of Horta At the age of 21, he entered the Franciscans as a brother and was soon known for his asceticism, humility, and simplicity. As cook, porter, and later the official beggar for the friars in Tortosa, he became well known for his charity. He healed the sick with the Sign of the Cross. When crowds of sick people began coming to the friary to see Salvator, the friars transferred him to Horta. Again, the sick flocked to ask his intercession;



one person estimated that 2,000 people a week came to see Salvator. He told them to examine their consciences, go to confession, and to receive Holy Communion worthily. He refused to pray for those who would not receive those sacraments.







He reconstructed the Holy Roman Empire, needed help of Otto I of Germany against Berenger II. The Imperial Act of Otto I created the 'Count Bishops.' This gave the Emperor the right to confirm papal elections. Pope John XII died May 14, 964.
