

A CUP OF JOE

Greetings in Christ, all; a blessed and holy Lenten Season to you!

I wanted to share a couple personal notes with you this week.

The first has to do with my new position as Dean. I've received some calls and offers to help and I want to say



straight off that I'm so grateful...thank you! At this time, the Diocese is still figuring all of this out so I'm not really in a position to ask for help or even know what kind of help I will need. I've been faithfully reading the material they sent me and I'm working on some plans, but for the most part, I am waiting until our Dean Initiation Meetings (there are three on the calendar) to find out how this is going to play out.

Some of you have expressed worries to me about my ability to do this but for whatever it is worth, I am excited. I do believe that an overhaul is desperately needed in our diocesan structure and this is a brave and strong step in that. Thank you for caring for me and about our Parish; it means the world.

The second thing is a very weighty matter: my weight. (I could not resist, sorry).

A few of you have lovingly expressed concerns about my weight. I am significantly heavier than when I moved here and at some point, I stopped paying attention. Over the last couple years, a lot of priests my age have been in the hospital and some have died and it breaks my heart. I want to serve for as long as I am useful and I know I sabotage that when I do not take care of myself. I have felt a call from the Lord that it was time to go to war on this front for a couple weeks and some of the wonderful people I work here with sat me down and shared their concerns. I was deeply touched and challenged.

So, with the help of the wonderful folks who work here at Holy Family, I've had some meetings with professionals and people I trust and so far, this Lent has been a real blessing in changing the way I eat.

My usual pattern was to either not eat all day and then go nuts at night or to eat badly when I do eat: choosing speed over health. Obviously, neither of these are a good idea.

Since Lent started, Fr. Le and I have all begun participating in a meal plan with a company that ships us meals that we basically assemble and eat. It's going really, really well and I am excited. We are eating healthy food in healthy portions and all three of us (Dad included) have noticed a difference in how we feel already.

As in the previous section, I'm so touched by your care for me and I ask for a couple things:

First, I am so grateful for all the pies and cookies and desserts, but I'm going to ask us to hold off on those. I find that I just eat whatever is there, bad or good for me and y'all make such crazy delicious desserts that I just plain get after it. I pray I do not sound ungrateful.

Second, please pray for me. I feel a good deal of shame about how much weight I've gained and I worry that I'm not disciplined enough to follow through on this long term. When you think about it, if you would pray for me that would mean a lot.

Thank you all for being such a beautiful people to minister to. I believe myself to be among the most blessed priests in the whole world.



March 19: St. Joseph

The Bible pays Joseph, the husband of the Blessed Virgin Mary, the highest compliment: he was a "just" man. The quality meant a lot more than faithfulness in paying debts. When the Bible speaks of God "justifying" someone, it means that God, the all-holy or "righteous" one, so transforms a person that the individual



shares somehow in God's own holiness, and hence it is really "right" for God to love him or her. In other words, God is not playing games, acting as if we were lovable when we are not. By saying Joseph was "just," the Bible means that he was one who was completely open to all that God wanted to do for him. He became holy by opening himself totally to God.

Our Catholic Heritage

by Earl Hagen 78th Pope – Donus

Born in Rome, he was elected Pope September 2, 676. He succeeded in finally halting the schism of the Church in Ravenna which had protracted through the reign of Vitalian from the mid 670s. Pope Donus, with the help




of Emperor Constantine Pogonatus managed to convince Archbishop Theodore of Constantinople to accept the pope's authority. Donus expanded the clergy of Rome with twelve new priests and five deacons. He also consecrated six bishops for various sees. He encouraged Bishops to support the new schools in Germanic Gaul and that of Cambridge in England. Pope Donus died April 2, 678. He is buried in the Vatican Grottoes.

Encourage Deeper Understanding of Scripture



God asks a rhetorical and slightly sarcastic question to Samuel, the prophet: "How long will you grieve for Saul, whom I have rejected as king of Israel?" Like us, Samuel is depressed that the old king failed. It's painful to admit that the old regime is done. But God won't let us wallow our pity-party forever. "I am sending you to Jesse of Bethlehem," announces the Lord, "for I have chosen my king from among his sons." Samuel finally goes and anoints the young David as the new king. And his kingdom is glorious; it's the golden age of Israel's earthly history.

How discouraging to see that my own selfish ego is no longer in charge! How long will I grieve that money, power, pleasure, and reputation have been rejected as the ruler of my life? How wonderful that God has a new future in store for you and me. He is sending us to Bethlehem to anoint the new David as our king. His kingdom won't fail us. He'll slay our goliaths, unite our dispersed energies, and build a Temple where God himself will dwell.
