Holy Cow, Lent is here! Can you believe it? On Ash Wednesday, we will add a Mass. We'll be praying Mass at:

- 8:00 am
- 6:00 pm

At 12:15 pm, we will have a service for the distribution of ashes. It'll look like Mass all the way through until the homily when we will distribute ashes and then prayerfully conclude.



This year, Fr. Le and I will be preaching some of the Corporal Works of Mercy and the Spiritual Works of Mercy for our Lenten homilies. We are quite excited about this! The only bummer in the midst of it all is that this Lent we will not be able to offer 12 hours of confession as we have the last six years. There simply aren't enough priests to cover it. The good news? We will have three priests available at every scheduled confession time during Lent, instead of two. Praise God. Please plan your Lenten Confession well.

I want to end on a serious note. I've noticed some ads in our community for Tarot Card Readings, Palm Readings, Fortune Telling, etc. As your priest, I simply cannot encourage you strongly enough to stay away from these things. This is witchcraft and we stay away from such things with no exceptions. Whether the person is running a scam or is sincere doesn't matter to the spirits that infect our world; they will seize any chance to damage us or separate us from God's grace. Please, please do not participate in any of this.

If you have done so in the past, please make sure to mention it in your next confession so that Jesus can forgive and heal you. He loves you so much.

Thanks for hearing me out on this, I share this with you with great love and care. I don't want us doing anything in innocence or ignorance that could hurt our souls.

I love being your priest. Let's really get after it together this Lent.

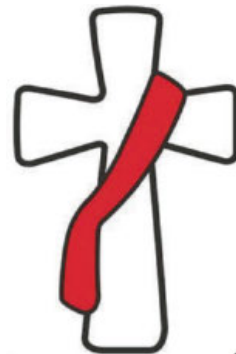

Our Catholic Heritage

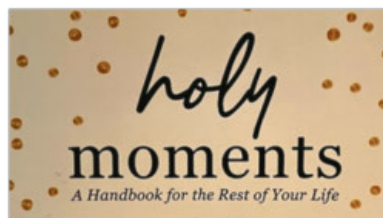
180th Pope Innocent IV
(1243-54)

Born in Genoa, Italy, in 1195. Born with the given name of Sinibaldo Fieschi. He became pope June 25, 1243. Born as the 6th of 10 children.



He was among the most important popes of the medieval period. He engaged in a policy of deliberate nepotism far more than any popes who preceded him, starting a trend that only grew worse over the following centuries. He has been negatively remembered for his *Ad extirpanda* papal bull (type of public decree) that allowed the Inquisition to employ torture in forcing heretics to confess.

After years of plotting and scheming to overthrow Conrad IV and Manfred (the illegitimate son of Frederick II) as the rulers of southern Italy, Innocent's grand papal army suffered a crushing defeat at Manfred's hands. While in southern Italy, he was lying in bed sick when word reached him of the victory. The news was so upsetting that he died unexpectedly five days later on December 7, 1254.

THE PROGRESS DELUSION

You cannot improve your life in any meaningful way without improving as a human being. And what is true for one person is true for an entire society. Virtue is the only way for a society to make genuine progress.

Virtues are building blocks of character. "Character is destiny," the Greek philosopher Heraclitus observed. This is true for a person, a marriage, a family, community, nation, and indeed, the whole human collective. Character is moral and ethical excellence. It is built one virtue upon another, and the progress of the human race depends upon it.

We look to science, technology, education, and economic growth as the champions of progress. These each have a role to play, but their success in bringing about human flourishing rests upon the virtue and character of the people driving these initiatives.

March 7: Sts. Felicity and Perpetua

Despite threats of persecution and death, Perpetua, Felicity – a slave woman and expectant mother – and three companions, Revocatus, Secundulus and Saturninus, refused to re-



nounce their Christian faith. For their unwillingness, all were sent to the public games in the amphitheater. There Perpetua and Felicity were beheaded, and the others killed by beasts. Felicity gave birth to a girl a few days before the games commenced. Perpetua's record of her trial and imprisonment ends the day before the games.

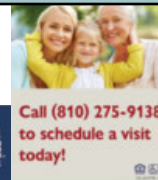
