


### St. Michael the Archangel

# A CUP OF JOE

Greetings in Christ, all! A blessed and holy Lenten season to you.

This week, we will continue our Lenten Homily Focus on the Corporal and Spiritual works of Mercy. For this weekend, we will look at two Spiritual Works of Mercy: Forgiving Injuries and Bearing Wrongs Patiently. To forgive someone does not mean we pretend it didn't happen. It doesn't necessarily mean our relation-



ship with them is restored. Forgiveness is a decision to release someone from the effects of their sin as far as the forgiver is concerned. This can help us avoid the cycle of reliving the event over and over in our minds, making the wound fresh again. When we decide to forgive, we decide that, with God's help, each memory of our wound(s) will result in us saying, "Jesus, I forgive that person." We will do this until the power of our past no longer decides our present.

To bear wrongs patiently means that we trust that God can bring good from our pain. It means we understand that every living human hurts others, at times on purpose, often by accident. It's an agreement we make with the people in our lives that frees them from our desire that they be perfect.

Both of these are huge challenges, but challenges that are not optional for us Christians. We who seek to be like Christ need to act like Christ and in this case, that means we forgive and we bear wrongs patiently. Pray that Fr. Le and I preach these essential truths well!

This weekend, on Friday night and Saturday morning, I will be traveling down to Toledo, Ohio. A bunch of Catholic schools are getting together for a baseball tournament. I will pray Mass with them, give a talk and then head back home.

I have a big favor to ask...your Parish Family needs your help. We are looking for a number of volunteers who speak Vietnamese and English. Many of our Catholic family are Vietnamese and we need help translating so that we can love and serve them well. Catholicism has a noble and amazing history in Vietnam and has produced Saints and Martyrs for a very long time. We are blessed to pray with such amazing people. If anyone reading this is fluent in Vietnamese and English, we could really use your help. If you could, just call our parish office and let us know that we can call you if we need help. This would be a great blessing to us.

So...that's it! One more week of Lent, one more week closer to Easter! May Jesus bless our efforts to be like Him. I'm so grateful to Jesus that I get to be your priest,


# WHAT'S HAPPENING HERE





#### **Our Catholic Heritage**

**183rd Pope Clement IV** (1265-68) Born on November 23, 1190, in the Kingdom of France, birth name, Gui Foucois. Clement IV was elected pope on February 5, 1265.



His father worked as a lawyer while his mother stayed home raising

children. He enlisted in the military and attended college upon returning home. Later, he married and had two daughters. After his wife died, he found his way to the church, becoming a pastor, then bishop at age 67, archbishop ten months later, papal legate by age 71 and finally pope at age 74.

A conflicted relationship existed with Charles of Anjou (brother of King Louis IX's of France). Although he disapproved of the beheadings performed by Charles of Anjou while in Sicily, he remained close to him, even giving Charles money for his war efforts, although not happy with what he did with the funds. Some viewed the pope as an accomplice in many ways by refusing to speak out against Charles in public. It wasn't that he was afraid to do so, for he did so regarding some of the decisions made by his predecessor Gregory IX: against the religious text called the Talmud even having the text burned in some public settings.

Following his death the Church was without a pope for almost three years as the cardinals could not reach a majority decision due to infighting among themselves.


Clement IV died on November 29, 1268, at the age of 78, in Viterbo of natural causes.

#### Saint

March 23: St. Turibius of Mogrovejo Together with Rose of Lima, Turibius is the first known saint of the New World, serving the Lord in Peru, South America, for 26 years. Born in Spain and educated for the law, he became so brilliant a scholar that he was made professor of law at the University of Salamanca and eventually became chief judge of the Inquisition at Granada. He succeeded too well. But he was not sharp enough a lawyer to prevent a surprising sequence of events. When the archdiocese of Lima in Peru required a new leader, Turibius was



chosen to fill the post: He was the one person with the strength of character and holiness of spirit to heal the scandals that had infected that area. Though very poor his people were sensitive, dreading to accept public charity from others. Turibius solved the problem by helping them anonymously. Turibius is a patron saint of indigenous rights, Latin American bishops, and Peru.


