

A CUP OF JOE

Greetings in Christ, all! I wanted to take a moment to tell you guys about last week. Most of you met Fr. Tom, a priest who came here from Florida to help us for a couple of days. Fr. Tom is part of a group called "Cross Catholic Outreach," an organization dedicated to caring for the poor and underprivileged. One of the ways they do this



is by uniting retired priests with parishes that need weekend help. With Fr. Le gone, we needed help but couldn't find any, so we called them and they were able to send us Fr. Tom...praise God. They left information out in the church if anyone wants to send them a donation.

This week we are excited to be celebrating the feast of St. Mark the Evangelist. My parish in Goodrich bears the name of this marvelous saint...what do we know about him?

Most of what we know comes from the New Testament. We know that when St. Peter escaped from prison, he fled to the home where St. Mark's mom lived. We know that he traveled with Sts. Paul and Barnabas on the first missionary journey and it appears he abandoned them at some point, which angered St. Paul. Because of that, he didn't go with Paul and Barnabas on their second journey. They seem to have reconciled, as St. Paul later asked St. Mark to visit him in prison. He is probably most famous for authoring the Gospel of Mark.

St. Mark was eventually made the Bishop of Alexandria, where he served faithfully and well. On Easter of 68 AD, he was arrested while celebrating Mass. He was beaten, tied to a horse and dragged through the streets until he died. His body lies in Venice at St. Mark's Basilica.

We are so grateful for St. Mark. We're grateful for his example and for his prayers.

I'll ask you to pray in a special way for the people of St. Mark in Goodrich this week.

May Jesus bless you all; I'm so thankful to God for all of you.

STEWARDSHIP

During the Easter season, we reflect on being followers of the stone that the builders rejected, the crucified and risen Jesus. Like a shepherd he leads us by his voice that echoes throughout the centuries and remains real and effective even in our modern world. To be his disciple means to risk rejection in a similar way as he experienced. The shepherd will not lead his lambs into danger, but there is danger all around us regardless.

Everyday Stewardship can be something we talk about in the abstract or a way of living we simply wish we could follow. It can be an imperfect reality that at times places us in direct conflict with the world. As we decrease and Jesus increases in us, many will be drawn to the love and compassion that flows through us. However, some will see us for fools and will suggest we are ridiculous. Cultivating our gifts for God's sake and the total surrender of all we possess and have become to God is not wise in some eyes. Either they think we are crazy, or, just maybe at times, the example of our lives causes them to question their own values.

If you give a little, you will be admired. If you give a lot, you will be celebrated. If you give it all, you can be rejected. Not everyone will have this negative reaction. Some will see your example and will seek to do the same. They will then join you in following the shepherd. They will become a true sign of Jesus Christ to the world. But their conversion of heart begins with you and your example.





135th Pope - Benedict VII

Born in Rome, was elected pope in October 974 with the support of the family of Tusculum counts. He was close to the Emperor and to the Roman aristocrats. In 981 he invoked the Lateran Council in which he drew up several mandates to condemn and repress simony,



which forbids the extraction of money for the conferring of any holy order.

He tried extremely hard to elevate the spiritual atmosphere of the clergy and the Church. He promoted the development of agriculture to help the common person. A man of great virtue, he tried to stem the debauchery and shameful ignorance which pervaded Italy and the Christian world. Pope Benedict VII died on July 10, 983, and is buried in Holy Cross in Jerusalem.









Gospel Meditation

Encourage Deeper Understanding of Scripture



Recently I was with my little dog Libby at a retreat center in the Arizona desert. I sat in a chair near a ravine filled with shrubs. Unbeknownst to me, Libby wandered down there and disappeared. Suddenly an animal's wild shriek erupted from the area. Without thinking, I bolted down into the ravine fully expecting to see coyotes, javelinas, or rattlesnakes. I didn't care. I desperately wanted to get Libby out of there, without any self-regard. Before I could face whatever danger lay hidden, my dog blissfully trotted out from an entirely different area, utterly unaware that I had (quite heroically) just placed my life on the line.

When the adrenaline wore off, I thought to myself: how far would I have been willing to go to save her? I don't know. But I do know, if I had literally died, my friends and family would have certainly thought me insane for dying for a dog. No offense, Libby.

How passionately Jesus wants us to know him and his willingness to die for us! This week he says, "I know my own and my own know me," and "I lay down my life for the sheep." Here we encounter an insanely excessive love for us. Christianity is a relationship and not simply a religion or ethical code. In Jesus, God rescues and saves us. He laid down his life for you and me — and he has taken it up again. So often we are like Libby — blissfully ignorant of the reality of both our spiritual danger and his saving love. This Easter season, the risen Jesus calls us to be more conscious than ever before about his love. He never ceases to lay down his life for us.




