


#### Our Catholic Heritage by Earl Hagen 83rd Pope – Conon

Conon, a Greek, was born in Thrace, in the southeast Balkan region. He was very ill when elected on October 21, 686. His pontificate was deeply disturbed by anarchy and animosity which prevailed in the Church during that time. Often the victim of sly follow-



ers of the new Byzantine Emperor Justinian II (Son of Constantine Pogonat). Conon bargained with Justinian II to lower the taxes on ordinary citizens. Some criticized Conon for that relationship because he exchanged papal properties for the tax decrease. Conon helped Justinian bring back more than 10,000 citizens from Lebanon. Pope Conon died Sept. 21, 687, and is buried in St. Peter's Basilica. Gospel Meditation Encourage Deeper Understanding of Scripture



I always feel a little sad when someone begins to speak to me with the words, "Father, I know you're so busy, but ..." It happens a lot. And I get it. He or she is trying to be respectful of my time. But it saddens me because a priest makes Jesus present to people in a special way, and Jesus always has time for us. Don't we all feel at times that God just doesn't have time for us?

Nonsense. Just look at the stunning "Road to Emmaus" story we hear this week. It's the day Jesus rose from the dead. And the Risen One appears in disguise to two disciples. He walks with them, chats with them, and eventually eats with them. It could have been hours he spends with them — two unnamed persons — in the middle of no-where. On the day he rose from the dead!

My friends, please take this to heart: The Risen Jesus is not too busy to spend time with you! He doesn't have "better things to do." You and I are members of this crucified and risen Body. He therefore has all the time in the world to be with us. So, I challenge you this week to approach him confidently in prayer and conversation. After all, being with you and me is the reason he rose from the dead.

## Saint

April 23: St. George Legend states that St. George was born at Cappadocia and was instructed in the Christian religion by his mother. He became a soldier in the Roman army and confronted Diocletian, the cruel persecutor of Christians. As a result, George was handed over to the torturers, who tried every means to put him to death; but he came through all the tortures unscathed. Pretending to offer sacrifice to the pagan idols, with all the people assembled, George prayed and fire came down from heaven, killing all the pagan priests and people. In the end, George was beheaded. The crusaders consid-



ered St. George to be their patron. He was also named the patron of England in 1222. Until 1778 the feast of St. George was a holy day of obligation for English Catholics. In iconography, St. George is portrayed as the conqueror of the dragon.








