



Pope Francis Biography

Pope Francis, born Jorge Mario Bergoglio on December 17, 1936, in Buenos Aires, Argentina, was the first pope from the Americas and the first Jesuit to lead the Catholic Church. Before his election as pope on March 13, 2013, he served as Archbishop of Buenos Aires, where he was known for his humility, simple lifestyle, and dedication to the poor.

Raised in a family of Italian immigrants, he studied chemistry before entering the seminary and joining the Jesuits. Ordained a priest in 1969, he later became the Provincial of the Jesuits in Argentina and played a key role in guiding the Church during a period of economic and social crises in the country. When he was appointed bishop in 1992 and archbishop in 1998, he prioritized evangelization, social justice, and pastoral outreach.

As pope, Francis emphasized mercy, care for the marginalized, and environmental stewardship. His papacy was marked by a call for a "poor Church for the poor," interfaith dialogue, and reform within the Vatican. His teachings focused on compassion, the dignity of every person, and the need for a missionary Church.

On April 21, 2025, Pope Francis passed away, leaving behind a legacy of love, humility, and service.

- Relics at Holy Family -

Feast Day | May 1



Peregrine Laziosi was born in 1265 in Forlì, Italy and the first part of his life did not seem to indicate that there was a saint in the making. He was violently opposed to the Pope and Rome and joined a group opposed to Rome. The Pope sent a priest named Philip Benizi of the Servite Order to his town to try to bring people back to the Church. Upon his arrival, Philip began to speak to the crowd that gathered, when he was dragged off the stage and beaten by a mob. Young Peregrine pushed him down and beat him. Shortly after, Peregrine felt tortured by his cruelty and went back to the priest and asked his forgiveness, which Philip gave joyfully. The two became inseparable. Peregrine aggressively pursued a life of holiness and service. The Blessed Mother appeared to him and led him to join the Servite order. He absolutely poured himself out in service to the poor and in his daily prayer life. He intervened in bad situations and brought peace and joy so often that the people in town began to call him "The Angel of Good Counsel." At one point, he discovered a large, painful cancerous tumor on his foot. He tried to push on, but the pain was too great. The doctor and he agreed that they had to amputate. The night before the surgery, Peregrine dreamt that Christ touched his foot and healed it. When he awoke, the tumor was gone. For the rest of his life, people came to him for prayers and many experienced miracles, some happening when he simply whispered the name of Jesus in their ears. He died on May 1st of 1345. He is the Patron Saint of persons suffering from cancer, AIDS and other life threatening illnesses.

St. Peregrine, whom Holy Mother Church has declared a Patron for those suffering from cancer, I confidently turn to you for help in my present sickness. I beg your kind intercession. Ask God to relieve me of this sickness if it be His Holy Will. Plead with the Blessed Virgin Mary, the Mother of Sorrows, whom you loved so tenderly and in union with whom you have suffered the pains of cancer, that she may help me with her powerful prayers and loving consolation.

But if it should be God's Holy Will that I bear this sickness, obtain for me courage and strength to accept these trials from the loving hand of God with patience and resignation, because he knows what is best for the salvation of my soul.

St. Peregrine, be my friend and patron. Help me to imitate you in accepting my suffering and to unite myself with Jesus crucified and the Mother of Sorrows, as you did. I offer my pains to God with all the love in my heart, for his glory and for the salvation of souls, especially my own. Amen.





Our Catholic Heritage

by Earl Hagen 188th Pope Nicholas III (1277-80)

Born in Rome in 1225, as Giovanni Gaetano Orsini into an Italian family with very politically influential and religious ties that five popes were appointed from. He was appointed pope at age 52 with much controversy. Although a trusted ally of



Church leaders, he was not ordained a priest and not a chosen candidate by the King of France. He headed one of the most controversial and corrupt Papal rules from 1277 to 1280 and was haunted throughout his career by accusations of corruption and nepotism, often referred to as a thoughtful and intelligent Pope, rewarding his family members with lands, wealth, and positions of power. His continued fame came from the poem, "The Inferno" written by Dante which condemned him to Hell for the crime of selling Church offices and positions.

Pope Nicholas III died unexpectedly while staying at his country house in Castro Soriano. He suddenly lost consciousness, unable to move, perhaps from a stroke, dying without being able to speak. Because of how quickly his illness came on, he was unable to make his final confession before he died. He had been pope for just under three years.

Pope Nicholas III died on August 22, 1280.

THE POWER OF HOLY MOMENTS

We have all heard phrases like ripple effect, domino effect, butterfly effect, snowball effect, and compounding effect. Each of these phenomena are astoundingly powerful, and yet, take them all, multiply them by infinity, and you will still have barely a glimpse of the power contained in each Holy Moment.

One day, when God invites us into His library to read His history books, we will see that it is so. On that day we will discover that seemingly insignificant acts, the smallest acts of kindness, unnoticed acts of generosity, set in motion a series of events that altered the whole course of human history.

The ripple effect begins with a single ripple, the domino effect with a single domino, and so on. But we have been seduced by the spectacular, so we dismiss small as insignificant. Holy Moments are usually small and simple. This is why we dismissed the idea that they could transform our lives and change the world. We have a bias against things that are simple, even though there is genius in simplicity. We have a bias against small, thinking that bigger is always better.



April 29: St. Catherine of Siena St. Catherine was born at Siena in 1347. While still a young girl, she sought the way of perfection and entered the Third Order of St. Dominic. On fire with love of God and neighbor, she established peace and concord between cities, vigorously fought for the rights and freedom of the Roman Pontiff, convincing him to return to Rome from Avignon. St. Catherine received the stigmata. She also promoted the renewal of religious life. She composed works of doctrine and spiritual inspiration. She died in 1380.


