

### St. Michael the Archangel



It's a wild thing to think of, but a very small percentage of the population of Jerusalem would've even been aware of the death of Jesus. Roman



records back up the Biblical account that in the year Jesus died, Pilate presided over the crucifixion of over 3,000 Jews. Most people simply lived their normal life that day and were never aware of the radical significance of Jesus' crucifixion. He was just one name and one story among many.

Yet, here we are 2,000 years later, joining over 1,000,000,000 Catholics around the world who set aside this day and this season to celebrate the Suffering, Death and Resurrection of Jesus.

In this season, I ask us to be aware. Be aware of what we believe and whether we really believe it. Do you honestly believe that God took flesh, became one of us, suffered death and rose from the dead body and soul?




# How to Receive a Plenary Indulgence for Divine Mercy Sunday

- On Divine Mercy Sunday: In any church or chapel, in a spirit that is completely detached from the affection for a sin, even a venial sin, take part in the prayers and devotions held in honor of Divine Mercy.
- In the presence of the Eucharist exposed or reserved in the tabernacle, in a spirit that is completely detached from the affection for a sin, even a venial sin, recite the Our Father and the Creed, adding a devout prayer to the merciful Lord Jesus, such as "Merciful Jesus, I trust in you!"



#### Saint

#### April 11: St. Stanislaus

(July 26, 1030 - April 11,1079)


Born in Szczepanow near Kraków on July 26, 1030, he was ordained a priest after being educated in the cathedral schools of Gniezno, then capital of Poland, and at Paris. He was appointed preacher and



archdeacon to the bishop of Kraków, where his eloquence and example brought about real conversion in many of his penitents, both clergy and laity. He became bishop of Kraków in 1072. During an expedition against the Grand Duchy of Kiev, Stanislaus became involved in the political situation of Poland. Known for his outspokenness, he aimed his attacks at the evils of the peasantry and the king, especially the unjust wars and immoral acts of King Boleslaus II. The king first excused himself, then made a show of penance, then relapsed into his old ways. Stanislaus continued his open opposition in spite of charges of treason and threats of death, finally excommunicating the king. Enraged, the latter ordered soldiers to kill the bishop. When they refused, the king killed Stanislaus with his own hands.

# Gospel Meditation Encourage Deeper Understanding of Scripture



"When Jesus had risen, early on the first day of the week, he appeared first to Mary Magdalene, out of whom he had driven seven demons." (Mark 16:9)

Popular Catholic piety sometimes posits that the newly risen Jesus appears first to the Blessed Virgin Mary. It is a happy thought, but it's simply not what the scriptures report. We are told quite directly that he appeared first to Mary Magdalene, "out of whom he had driven seven demons."

Why would the gospel writer remind us of this unsavory detail of Mary's past? Historians tell us women were not qualified to give legal testimony. On top of that, to be possessed by not just one, but seven demons, is unsavory and terrifying. What damage had they done to her? What did she do to allow herself to be home to such evil? It doesn't seem to matter. Jesus chose Mary Magdalene to be the first one who saw him risen from the dead. He decided she was qualified.

Do you think that you are disqualified from seeing and announcing the risen Jesus because of your past demons? Maybe they are the demons of despair, confusion, self-hatred, pride, addiction, failure, boredom, laziness, or other sins. Well, don't. In the light of the Risen Jesus, all these past demons make our witness that much more believable — only if we allow ourselves to be touched by the liberating hand of Christ, just as Mary Magdalene did.



### Our Catholic Heritage

by Earl Hagen 81st Pope – Benedict II



Born in Rome, he was elected pope on June 26, 684. He restored the privilege of sanctuary, no longer respected by fighting factions who penetrated churches in their search for their enemies. Imperial confirmation of popes was losing its strength, as this procedure was extremely cumbersome. Finally, the

pious Emperor Constantine Pogonat wrote a letter informing Rome that Imperial confirmation for election of popes will no longer be required. He succeeded in liberating the Church from the interference of the Emperor. Churches of Rome were restored by him, its clergy, and deaconries in their care of the poor. Lay sacristans all benefited by his liberality. Pope Benedict II died May 8, 685, and was buried in St. Peters.


