That's what we got! Jesus bless you guys. I love being your priest!





FOLLOWING OUR FAITH

Our Catholic Heritage

by Earl Hagen **190th Pope Honorius IV** (1285-87)

Pope Honorius IV was born in 1210 A.D., birth name, Giacomo Savelli. He became Pope May 20th, 1285 A.D., taking the name Honorius IV. Born into a rich and powerful family in Rome, he studied at the University of Paris in France. He was the grandnephew of a previ-



ous pope. In 1261 A.D., he became the Cardinal Deacon of Santa Maria, and papal prefect to Tuscany, as well as captain for the army of the pope. As Cardinal, he received unanimous election to the papacy on the first ballot, despite the fact that he was both aged and crippled.

On March 31 of 1282 A.D. he became embroiled in the terrible conflict that led to the Sicilian Vespers massacre. As he watched events unfold firsthand, he opted to pursue a softer more peaceful and diplomatic approach to reconciling the conflict without resorting to the use of the papal army. He preferred diplomacy whenever he could in his career.

He became the first head of the church to use the important family banking houses in northern and central Italy to help collect the papal dues. Pope Honorius turned out to be the last of the popes to be married before being ordained.

Pope Honorius IV died on April 3, 1287, of old age as stillreigning pope. This was not surprising to his contemporaries as he was crippled when elected pope only two years earlier at age 75.

Excerpts from God in the Diary of Saint Sister Maria Faustina (Diary, 232)



"My daughter, tell him everything and reveal your soul to him as you do

May 15: St. Isidore - St. Isidore was born in Madrid, Spain and was a farm laborer for his entire life. He married a poor girl who was as holy as himself. After their one son died in infancy, they lived the rest of their married lives in perfect chastity. Isidore was a man of intense prayer and his life was marked by numerous miracles and supernatural interventions. Both he and his wife are venerated as saints. He was formally canonized in 1622 along with St. Teresa of Avila, St. Ignatius, and



St. Philip Neri. The body of St. Isidore is still intact.
