

First Communion was such a blessing last weekend; praise God! Fr. Le and I are so very touched by the children who received our Lord for the first time in our community. May Jesus bless their beautiful hearts to receive Him in their whole lives and to respond to that reception with love and devotion.



This weekend we celebrate the Ascension of our Lord. We see the basic pattern of God's saving work in the order of the Church calendar.

The beginning of the Church year is December, when we celebrate Jesus being born. In His Person, He combined the divine and human nature. In this, He made the human experience holy (except for sin, of course).

In Lent we celebrate the fact that he took the divine and human nature with Him through His passion and death. A good way to think of it is this way: "He had to have a human nature to take on sin. He had to have a divine nature to conquer it."

So, His human nature allowed Him to take on sin and die, thus killing our sin.

Then, He rose: showing He didn't just kill our sin, His love was/is stronger than all of it.

In the Ascension, He takes that human nature with Him to Heaven, thus "throwing open the gates of Heaven" for those of us who also have a human nature. Not only that, but because of His human nature, the risen Jesus would have been limited on earth by the ability to only be one place at a time. By ascending to Heaven, He was/is preparing to send us His Holy Spirit so that we as a family on earth are able to be Jesus everywhere we go.

This is some powerful stuff and we are so blessed to be a part of it. Jesus' Ascension is something He did for us and to us. Praise God.



FOLLOWING OUR FAITH



A few months ago, I had the singular privilege of a private meeting with Pope Francis. We were a small group of pastors, composed largely of non-Catholics. The Holy Father wished to discuss our work for Christian unity. The phrase I remember him saying with greatest frequency was: *Tutti dentro*. It means, "Everyone in." He clearly wanted us to emphasize that the Church is made for the whole human race, not a select few. At the center of his concern was unity. We are all brothers and sisters, he said multiple times. The Church's primary longing is for everyone to join Her.

This longing is at the heart of this Ascension feast day. We hear the longest recorded prayer of the one whom Pope Francis represents. Jesus' concern is unity, praying to the Father, "that they may be one, even as we are one" (John 17:11). The deep unity of all people in Christ through the power of the Holy Spirit is what Jesus most desires. It is what he ascends to accomplish.

Do we have this same burning desire in our hearts, too? Or do we see Christian unity as an unrealizable dream? Or worse, as something that threatens our own narrow tribal interests? This feast is a wonderful time to consider our attitude toward Christian unity, and to commit to do whatever we can to foster it. It is the Pope's desire because it is that of Jesus — and it should be ours, too.




FOLLOWING OUR FAITH

May 15: St. Isidore -

St. Isidore was born in Madrid, Spain and was a farm laborer for his entire life. He married a poor girl who was as holy as himself. After their one son died in infancy, they lived the rest of their married lives in perfect chastity. Isidore was a man of intense prayer and his life was marked by numerous miracles and supernatural interventions. Both he and his wife are venerated as saints. He was formally canonized in 1622 along with St. Teresa of Avila, St. Ignatius, and St. Philip Neri. The body of St. Isidore is still intact.

Our Catholic Heritage

138th Pope - Gregory V

Born in Saxony, he was elected May 3, 996. He was the first pope of German nationality. His rigid character and his nationality made him unpopular with the Romans. This attitude was encouraged by Nobleman Giovanni Crescentius and ultimately Gregory V was forced to leave Rome and flee to Pavia, Ita-



ly. The antipope John XVII was then nominated to replace Gregory V by Crescentius and subsequently reigned for almost a year. When Otto III returned (998), a reign of terror ensued: Antipope John XVII was deposed and mutilated, Crescentius was executed, and Gregory V was reinstated as pope (998). Gregory V instituted the commemoration of the dead. Gregory V died suddenly of malaria, but not without suspicion of foul play, on February 18, 999. He is buried in St. Peter's Basilica.




