
St. Michael the Archangel





St. Cecilia Music Scholarship

Musically gifted students in high school, college and graduate school can be eligible for St. Cecilia Music Scholarship through our parish as a singer or an instrumentalist. The St. Cecilia Scholarship is funded by various parishioners and groups to promote the ministries of the young musicians who are willing to share their time and talents through our musical and liturgical ministries.

To selected students, the scholarship of \$500-1,500 will be awarded to each student and Dr. Simon Lee may offer **free music lessons** during this summer.

To apply for the scholarship, applicants must have a musical skill or potential, and be willing to share it at our

parish liturgies and services. The application letter may be emailed to Dr. Simon Lee at musicdirector@hfgb.org or delivered to the parish office by May 31. A brief audition and interview with our Music Ministry Project Committee may be scheduled in June.

Saint

May 20: St. Bernardine of Siena - St. Bernardine lost

both his parents before the age of 7. At the age of 22 he entered the Friars Minor and spent the first 12 years devoted to prayer. In 1417 he began his ministry as a preacher. He was commissioned to reform the Franciscan Order and worked as a peacemaker between feuding cities. In 1427, Pope Martin V asked him to accept the bishopric of Siena but he refused. St. Bernardine had a special love for the Holy Name of Jesus which he con-



sidered to be a compendium of Scripture and a symbol of unity. He invented the logo IHS which stands for lesus Hominum Salvator (Jesus Savior of mankind). St. Bernardine died on the vigil of the Ascension in 1444 and was canonized a saint 6 years later.

Our Catholic Heritage

86th Pope - John VII

Born in Rossano di Calabria, he was elected pope on March 1, 705. He had strained relations with Justinian II in his attempt to win back Italy in terms of power and respect. John II refused to consent to the ambiguous claims of Emperor Justinian II. The massacre of Latin people drove them to separate



themselves from the Eastern Empire. John consolidated the temporal power of the popes by requiring the Lombard King Heribert II to give back certain territories. Further confrontation was generated with support from some of the bishops. John VII was replaced by Pope Gabriel, who was among the original candidates for pope in 705. John II was restored as pope after the death of Gabriel III. This is the only occasion in history when the Coptic Orthodox Church had two popes at the same time. John VII died October 18, 707.





Encourage Deeper Understanding of Scripture



My dad was adopted as a baby. It's a big part of my family's story. His birth mother placed him in a Catholic orphanage not long after birth. A young couple longing for a baby strolled among the bassinets. My father, then only a few months old, looked at the husband and smiled. The man said, "That's my son." They took him home and the family grew. This moment of adoption was a wonderful truth they celebrated even when my dad was a young boy. They told him, "You're even more special than the other children, because we chose you to be our son." My dad's eyes well up with tears of gratitude whenever he tells the story, even eighty-three years later.

What is your story? Do we think or act like unwanted orphans? Who do we believe ourselves to be? As we continue to ponder Jesus' resurrection, we hear him say to us this Sunday, "I will not leave you orphans." God doesn't leave us alone like spiritual orphans. The power that raised Jesus from the dead is the Holy Spirit, who is also called the Spirit of Adoption. He chooses us to be His children, to share God's life forever. He gives us a future filled with hope.

We are not orphans anymore! This Easter, that's the story we should share with others. It's the true story we are living right now.
