A CUP OF JOE

Greetings in Christ, Happy Easter!

I've got a couple of things to run by you guys in regard to me as a person and my schedule. First thing is oddly embarrassing. As you may know, my right knee tends to be a

problem; I've had a number of procedures on it and the last one was the best. My right knee has been completely pain-free for a month now. The bad news is that, for the first time in my life, my left knee is killing me! I'm very frustrated by this. I guess I overrelied on it for too long and now, when I get up, it really hurts for a bit. If I keep walking, the pain gets a lot better. I'm telling you this for a couple of reasons: one,



after my first Mass of the day, I'm not always able to stand and distribute communion. I hate hate hate not distributing communion and promise I'm doing my best to avoid missing it. The second reason I'm telling you is that I set up another doctor appointment to look at it. I'll keep you updated on this front.

The next thing I want to run by you is Thursdays. Typically, my Thursday starts with Mass at Holy Family and then I head over to my other parish, St. Mark, and work with the staff there. I'm going to change it up a bit so that I can be more faithful to my duties as Dean.

I don't know if you remember, but the Bishop appointed me as Dean of ten other parishes and I don't feel like I've been doing as good a job as I should on that front. The requirements of the Dean are manifold, but the two duties I feel I need to be better at are regularly visiting each parish and regularly meeting with each priest. I've been frustrated trying to figure out how to do all of these things and be a pastor at two parishes. Fr. Steve called us a couple of weeks ago and offered to help us here, so we went ahead and signed him up for some Thursday Masses. This way, I can go straight to St. Mark on Thursday mornings and after that, go off and meet with priests and do parish visits in my Deanery.

Progress on our new building continues and I am so very excited about the day we finish! Please keep those amazing workers and Morgan Construction in your prayers. These folks are great.

I'm so grateful to God for you all and I just love being your priest. Jesus bless you!





WHAT'S HAPPENING HERE

Gospel Meditation

Encourage Deeper Understanding of Scripture

I've always found it amazing that Jesus never says to his disciples the straightforward and bumper stickery words "I love you" or "I will always love you" (a la Dolly Parton's song). Why doesn't Jesus say, "I love you"?

Well, actually he does, but in particular ways. He says, "As the Father loves me, so I love you" (John 15:9) thereby rooting his love for us in the space of the Holy Trinity. This week he commands, "Love another as I have loved you" (John 13:34). He presents his love for us as a completed action which continues into the present moment. How has he loved us? By becoming one of us, one with us, and finally giving his life for us in his suffering on the cross. We weren't there when he did that, but neither were his Apostles (except one). Still, that action is his great "I love you" to us.

His love is also hedged in a command: "Love one another." So how can we practically follow it? The great St. John XXIII wrote in his diary that each day he followed this rule: "Only for today, I will do one good deed and not tell anyone about it." The hidden nature of a good deed is a sign that it is truly loving. This week, take on St. John XXIII's practical method of following Jesus' great commandment of love. It's a splendid way to say, "I love you."



Our Catholic Heritage

by Earl Hagen **191st Pope - Nicholas IV** (1288-92)

Pope Nicholas IV was born on September 30, 1227, birth, name Girolamo Masci, also known as Jerome Masci. From humble beginnings, he joined the Franciscan order when he was very young, and shortly after became a friar.



In 1278 he was appointed a

cardinal, and by 1281 he was promoted to Cardinal Bishop of Palestine. April 3, 1287, the papal conclave was held to select the next pope; however, due to the sudden death of six electors, all from fevers ten months later on February 1288, the surviving electors completed the election of the 191st pope. Pope Nicholas IV was elected when he was 61 years old, being the first Franciscan pope, as well as the first pope to be a cardinal and Franciscan Minister General. He was considered by people to be peaceloving.

As Pope, his priority was to fill the vacancies from the loss of the six previous cardinals who died during the Papal Conclave from fevers during the election process. In addition to filling the vacancies, he made a law that granted cardinals the authority to acquire income from the Holy See, the central government of the Catholic Church, and to share in the financial management, thus paving the way for the college of cardinals to become independent.

During his time as pope, he sent missionaries to work together with Bulgarians, Mongols, Ethiopians, Tatars, and Chinese.

Pipe Nicholas IV died on April 4, 1292.



St. John was born in Tuscany and elected Pope in 523. He went to Emperor Justin in Constantinople as an ambassador of the Arian King Theodoric. On his return he was captured by the king, who was displeased at the outcome of the embassy, and cast into prison at Ravenna where he died of starvation in 526. The inscription on his tomb reads: "Victim for Christ because of a forced journey."
