

St. Cecilia Music Scholarship

A brief audition and interview with our Music Ministry Project Committee may be scheduled.

To selected students, the scholarship of **\$500-1,500** will be awarded to each student and Dr. Simon Lee may offer **free music lessons**.

Spirit to Spirit

Talk to any couple who are devoted to one another. Ask them when they realized they were in love — call-me-in-acrisis love, face-the-day-to-day-with-me love — and the answer will probably not be "When I realized he was only dating me to win a bet with his boss."

If you know what movie that references, you and 12-yearold me would have been great friends.

Like any other self-respecting American tween of the early 2000s, I used to watch a lot of romantic comedies. I forget how old I was when I realized that romantic comedies are actually ... really boring. Not because they're about love — true love is fascinating. I could watch real-life people talk about who they love for hours.

Because when we say we love someone — truly love them — what we mean is we love their spirit. We love what they are. We love the qualities that escape description, the attributes we have to talk around or reduce to cliche in order to define. We cannot love a body alone. We cannot love a name or a reputation. We cannot love a story that we've built around a relationship.

To be in love with someone you need to know their spirit. Intimately. And that knowledge cannot help but change everything about you. It changes your goals, your understanding of the world. It changes the amount of courage you have to face the life ahead of you. It changes your ability to be who God wants you to be.

The disciples lived and ate and walked with Jesus for three whole years before they really knew his spirit. They didn't know it on Good Friday when they scattered and hid and wept. They didn't know it on Easter Sunday, when they couldn't believe what they saw. They thought they loved him, but when push came to shove their love failed.

But by the end of their lives, the disciples knew the kind of love that sustained them even in the face of martyrdom.

What was it that changed? It was the Spirit. They finally knew the Spirit.

Gospel Meditation

Encourage Deeper Understanding of Scripture



When I was twenty-two years of age in August of 2000, I experienced World Youth Day in Rome. As for many of my generation, the event was life-changing for me. Surrounded by joyful, hope-filled young people from seemingly every nation and tongue, we were gathered around the Pope, sharing a common Faith and love. The Pope spoke to us of our shared family bond in the Church and invited us to give our lives in service to others. Now twenty-four years later, my life as a priest, like that of so many others from those special days, continues on that same path of love and unity — despite my many weaknesses. What makes that continuation possible?

This week's feast gives the answer: the Holy Spirit. The gift of God — His very life — the third person of the Trinity, is the Spirit who animates the entire Church and each member of it. He makes us one-in-love in a way that utterly exceeds human capacity. For example, he makes the apostles speak with tongues of fire, and everyone hears them in his own native tongue. The Holy Spirit is the means by which Jesus establishes a new family, one that crosses all possible boundaries of time, space, and culture. The Holy Spirit never tires in enthusing us for mission.

Aren't we longing to experience the Holy Spirit in a fresh way? Today we celebrate this untiring flame, once ignited on earth and burning still. So, we humbly cry out: Come, Holy Spirit, fill the hearts of your faithful, and enkindle in us the fire of your love!

Saint

May 20: St. Bernardine of Siena - St. Bernardine lost both his parents before the age of seven. At the age of 22 he entered the Friars Minor and spent the first 12 years devoted to prayer. In 1417 he began his ministry as a preacher. He was commissioned to reform the Franciscan Order and worked as a peacemaker between feuding cities. In 1427, Pope Martin V asked him to accept the bish-



opric of Siena but he refused. St. Bernardine had a special love for the Holy Name of Jesus which he considered to be a compendium of Scripture and a symbol of unity. He invented the logo IHS which stands for lesus Hominum Salvator (Jesus Savior of mankind). St. Bernardine died on the vigil of the Ascension in 1444 and was canonized a saint six years later.

Personal preferences are great. We prefer certain types of food, music, chocolate, movies, sports, books, animals, and cities. We all have personal preferences. Tons of them. Our Catholic Heritage

139th Pope - Sylvester II

Born in Auvergne France, he was the first French pope and elected on April 2, 999. He was renowned for his scholarly achievements, his advances in education, and his shrewd political judgment. Highly cultured, he introduced the



use of Arabic numbers. Otto III, settled upon the Aventine Hill in Rome, assumed the roll of papal defender. Together, they were supposed to have brought peace back to the world and guide the people on the road to God in the new millennium. But an insurgence by the people and the Roman nobility forced Otto to leave Rome. His pontificate carried on over the famous year 1000, considered crucial for the Final Judgment. It was said: "A thousand and not another thousand". Sylvester II died May 12, 1003.




