

Greetings in Christ, all!

Sunday (and Saturday night), we celebrate the Ascension

of Our Lord. We see the basic pattern of God's saving work in the order of the Church calendar. The beginning of the Church year is December, when we celebrate Jesus being born. In His Person, He combined the divine and human nature. In this, He made the human experience holy (except for sin, of course).



In Lent, we celebrate the fact that he took the divine and human nature with Him through His

passion and death. A good way to think of it is this way: "He had to have a human nature to take on sin. He had to have a divine nature to conquer it."

So, His human nature allowed Him to take on sin and die, thus killing our sin.

Then, He rose: showing He didn't just kill our sin, His love was/is stronger than all of it.

In the Ascension, He takes that human nature with Him to Heaven, thus "throwing open the gates of Heaven" for those of us who also have a human nature.

Not only that, but because of His human nature, the risen Jesus would have been limited on earth by the ability to only be one place at a time. By ascending to Heaven, He was/is preparing to send us His Holy Spirit so that we as a family on earth are able to be Jesus everywhere we go.

This is some powerful stuff and we are so blessed to be a part of it.

Jesus' Ascension is something He did for us and to us. Praise God.



God bless you all. It would be hard for me to articulate how blessed I know I am to be your priest.



Our Catholic Heritage

87th Pope - Sisinnius

Born in Syria, he was extremely ill with gout when elected pope on January 15, 708, succeeding John VII after a vacancy of three months. This occurred during the period of Byzantine domination. There was little noteworthy to report in such a




brief pontificate. He worried about the restoration of the walls of Rome, constantly being menaced by the Lombards and Saracens. A man of strong character, he initiated collection funds for the restoration of these Aurelian walls in Rome. The restoration planned by Sisinnius was eventually carried out by Gregory II. Sisinnius died February 4, 708, and was buried in Old St. Peter's Basilica after one of the shortest pontificates in history.



Saint

May 21: St. Christopher Magallanes and Companions

St. Christopher, twenty -one diocesan priests, and three lay faithful were martyred for being a part of the Cristeros movement against the anti-Catholic Mexican government during the 1920s. St. Christopher had erected a seminary at Totatiche and ministered to the people secretly. When imprisoned, he was



heard to shout from his cell: "I am innocent and I die innocent. I forgive with all my heart those responsible for my death, and I ask God that the shedding of my blood serve the peace of our divided Mexico."

Gospel Meditation Encourage Deeper Understanding of Scripture



Traditionally, the four writers of the Gospels are symbolized by four creatures that make their way into Church art and architecture: Matthew, an angel; Mark, a lion; Luke, an ox; and John, an eagle. These images can be found in churches across the world, a nod to those who recorded the stories of Jesus for us, thousands of years ago.

Today's Gospel was written by John. There are a few reasons why John is symbolized by an eagle, but my favorite explanation is that his writings soar like an eagle into the sky with their beautiful, poetic language. The prayer we hear today is no different — Jesus invokes God in a long discourse that might seem mystifying at times, the same way that a poem can be perplexing to understand when we are unfamiliar with the pacing or format.

Consider holding onto the shortest sentence in this prayer: "I pray for them."

Jesus prays for us. For me. For you.

Let that sink deep into your being.

Jesus is on your side. He is aware of what you are holding at this moment. He is aware of your pain, your faith, your mission. And He's rooting for you. This prayer was recorded thousands of years ago, far before you were born. Since before you were born, you were held in prayer. With that certainty, we live.




