


St. Michael the Archangel

For us to live the Trinity, we must pray for and practice the grace of giving of ourselves and creating life wherever we go...what a blessing, what a challenge!




St. Cecilia Music Scholarship

Musically gifted students in 8th grade (in fall 2024), high school, college and graduate school can be eligible for the St. Cecilia Music Scholarship through our parish as a singer or an instrumentalist. The St. Cecilia Scholarship is funded by various parishioners and groups to promote the ministries of young musicians who are willing to share their time and talents through our musical and liturgical ministries.

To apply for the scholarship, applicants must have a musical skill or potential, and be willing to share it at our parish liturgies and services. The application letter may be emailed to Dr. Simon Lee at musicdirector@hfgb.org or delivered to the parish office by Monday, June 3. A brief audition and interview with our Music Ministry Project Committee may be scheduled.

To selected students, the scholarship of \$500-1,500 will be awarded to each student and Dr. Simon Lee may offer free music lessons.







he founded the Oratory where spiritual reading, singing and works of charity were practiced. He excelled in his love of neighbor and in evangelical simplicity, along with a joyous service to God. St. Philip died in 1595.

"You set aside ... self interest."

Why do we cling so tightly to self-interest? We aggressively defend and pursue self-interest because we believe if we don't look out for ourselves nobody else will. It is the fruit of the "every man for himself" ethos. It has its roots in Medieval times, having first appeared in Chaucer's *The Knight's Tale* in the late 1300s, but remains deeply embedded in today's culture.

This approach is a fundamental denial of God's providence. "God will not take care of me, so I have to take care of myself," is what it really proclaims.

God is more committed to your happiness and flourishing than anybody. But getting what you want doesn't make you happy. You know that and God never forgets it. What is good for you is better than what you want.

Our Catholic Heritage

140th Pope - John XVII

Born in Rome, he was elected pope on June, 1003, a period of grave disorder. This followed on the death of Otto III of Germany. There are no trustworthy details of his brief pontificate. He was elected by Rome's new leader Giovanni Crescenzi II. Pope John XVII died December, 1003 and was buried in Rome in the Basilica of St. John in Lateran.




