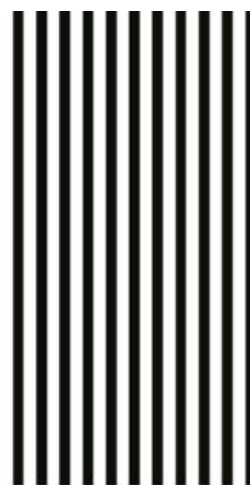

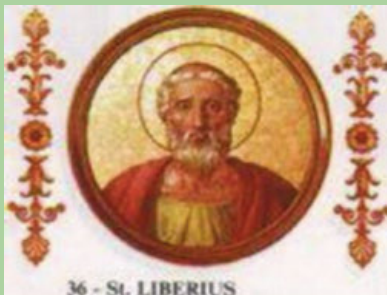
Our Catholic Heritage

36th Pope – Liberius

Born in Rome to the Savelli family, he was elected pope on May 17, 352. Emperor Constant, protector of the Arians, ordered Pope Liberius to approve the condemnation of Athanasius. Liberius did not agree and was exiled for his refusal.

During his absence, Archdeacon Felix II governed the Church. The controversy with the Arians continued and this led to the election of the antipope Felix II. In 338, Liberius returned to Rome and is responsible for laying the foundations of the Basilica of St. Mary Major. He died September 24, 366.

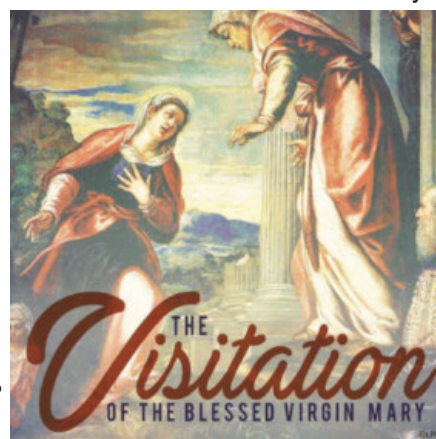

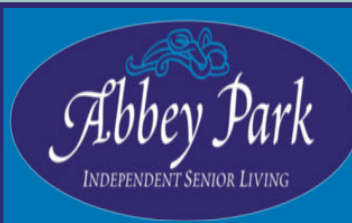

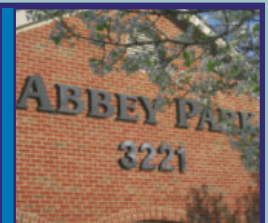
