Greetings in Christ! It's First Communion Weekend here at Holy Family and I couldn't be more excited. Praise God for our parents who understand the vital importance of this Most Blessed Sacrament. Praise God for our teachers who helped prepare them for it. Praise God for all of you who contribute to our parish so that we can do all these things. God is so good.



Next weekend is Ascension Sunday, when we remember and cherish Jesus ascending to Heaven after His resurrection. We'll get into the "Why" He did it at the homily. In terms of the "How" Jesus did it, I really have no idea. The weekend after that is Pentecost, when we celebrate Jesus pouring out His Holy Spirit on all of us.

Our Garage Sale was a huge success. We had over 60 volunteers who worked their tails off to help us gather and sell as much as possible. Because of the sacrifice of these volunteers and the many who donated things to be sold, we were able to raise more than \$14,000 for our parish: Praise God!

Last week, I needed to ask your forgiveness for messing up my Christmas thank you's; now I get to ask it again for messing up a sacramental decision. In the last couple of years, we've had some situations where we baptized kids who were seven or eight years of age. There were lots of reasons for this, but in general, these were children who were in class preparing for First Communion, were unbaptized, and whose families sought baptism for them. Whatever the reason, what I found out is that Church Law requires me to baptize AND CONFIRM (at that same time) anyone whom I baptize at or past the age of seven.

How does this mistake affect you? It really doesn't. This was a mistake I made based on ignorance, but there are no implications on the grace of the sacrament. I let our Diocese know and I will not make this error again. I apologize; please forgive me.

Thank you so much for letting me be a part of this Holy Family. I am so very grateful.

St. Cecilia Music Scholarship

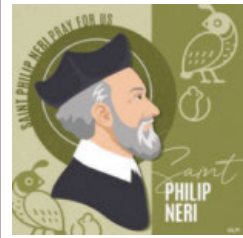

Saint

May 3: St. Philip and St. James



This feast dates from the 6th century and was formerly celebrated on May 1 to commemorate the dedication of the basilica in Rome where the relics of Philip and James are preserved. Philip was called to be an apostle the day after Peter and Andrew. He responded immediately to the call, convinced that Jesus was the promised

Messiah. Philip later preached the gospel in Phrygia, and possibly in Greece. He was martyred at Hierapolis and was buried there until his relics were transferred to Rome. James, the son of Alpheus and “brother” (cousin) of the Lord is also known as St. James the Less. He was so successful in winning converts to Christianity that the Scribes and Pharisees plotted his death. According to one account, he was thrown from the pinnacle of the Temple, and since he was not yet dead, he was stoned; finally he was dispatched by a blow to the head with a club. His martyrdom took place in the year 62.

137th Pope - John XV

Born in Rome, he was elected pope August 985. Involved in the passions generated by the abuse of power, this was one of the darkest periods in papal history, shadowed by the murders of the popes Benedict VI and John XIV.



The Roman noble family Crescenzi grew stronger and more powerful. John XV tried to free himself from their influence by granting many titles to family and friends, which greatly angered the nobility and the clergy. He was forced to flee to Tuscany. John XV was also forced to escape and ask for the help of Otto III, but just before Otto arrived in Rome, John XV died in March 996. He was buried in St. Peter’s Basilica. John XV was the first pope to undertake the process of solemn canonization of a saint.

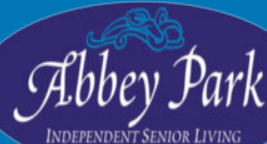
