

Greetings in Christ, all!

We've got some big news and big goings-on this week. Let's dive right in...

First, our 8th graders are graduating this week! Holy cow, this has been a great group of kids and we will miss them so much! We're going to have their graduation Mass during our usual Wednesday 6 pm Mass. Please come pray and rejoice with us.



Because of all the things we gotta do before that Mass, we won't be offering our usual confessions on Wednesday. We'll get after it as usual on Saturday.

The second thing is a big one. All over the diocese, our Bishop is asking us to gather in our parishes for 40 Hours of Eucharistic Adoration.

For those not familiar, this is a time when we bring the Blessed Sacrament outside of the Tabernacle and put it on the altar so people can come and sit with Jesus. It's a really wonderful experience, and I cannot encourage you strongly enough to set some time aside in your schedule and give Jesus some time with you.

Every parish in our deanery is doing this: we are all coordinated so that between June 8th and the Feast of the Body and Blood of Jesus, there will be Catholics in our Deanery sitting before Christ. It's really neat if you think about it.

Our days are June 9th to June 11th. During those days, we need parishioners to step forward and commit to sitting with Christ for a period of time. You can (AND SHOULD!) sign up for a slot of time by holding your phone up to the QR code over to the right.

This will take you to a sign-up sheet, and you can grab some time for you and/or your family. Please, help us fill these times. Join with the tens of thousands of Catholics in our deanery in making sure that for the next couple of weeks, there is never a time when someone isn't praying before the Blessed Sacrament.

All this is going to culminate in an amazing experience. On The Feast of The Body and Blood of Jesus (June 21st), all Catholics in the Diocese of Lansing are invited to go to Lugnut Stadium (now called Jackson Field) at 10 am and join the Bishop for Mass and a Eucharistic Procession to the Diocese of Lansing Cathedral. This should be an amazing experience and everyone who goes on this walk will receive a Jubilee Year indulgence.

So...lots to unpack here.

It's my sincerest hope that we give our all to this as a parish. When it comes to campaigns or asking for volunteers to help, it is inevitable that there will be those who cannot participate: life is complicated! On this, we all can help. Every parishioner can set aside some time to sit with Christ. Each of us can tell ourselves and those around us that Jesus is worth our time and that every single prayer we offer matters.

So, mark your calendar, pick your times, let's fill this Church and our entire deanery with heartfelt prayer!

40 Hours of Eucharistic Adoration – June 9–11

As part of a Diocesan-wide initiative from Pentecost to the Feast of Corpus Christi, Bishop Boyea has invited the entire Diocese to join him in deepening our devotion to the Eucharist. In response, each deanery is working together to offer two weeks of Eucharistic adoration, with each parish hosting 40 hours.

Our parish will host **40 Hours of Eucharistic Adoration from June 9 to 11**. All are encouraged to come and spend time with Our Lord in the Blessed Sacrament and join in this powerful time of prayer and unity. Below is the full schedule for our deanery so you can take part throughout the two weeks.

We are inviting parishioners to sign up as adorers. Whether you can spend 30 minutes or an hour, your presence matters deeply. Come and be with Jesus in the Eucharist.

Here at Holy Family, 40 hours of Adoration will begin Monday, June 9th, at 8 pm and end Wednesday, June 11th, at Noon.

Then, come together with Catholics from across the Diocese for the Feast of Corpus Christi Mass & Procession with Bishop Earl Boyea: **Saturday, June 21st, at 10 am** Mass at Jackson Field (home of the Lansing Lugnuts), followed by a Eucharistic Procession to St. Mary Cathedral.



Following the procession, there will be an opportunity to receive the Jubilee Year indulgence — a special grace for all who participate.

Let's gather in prayer, praise, and witness to Christ who remains with us in the Blessed Sacrament.


Everyone is welcome to join us in praying the rosary for peace in the world,

WHAT'S HAPPENING HERE



Bishop Earl Boyea has asked that we consider offering prayers, fasting, and almsgiving each Friday in June, Month of the Sacred Heart, for peace in the Holy Land.

This includes Friday, June 13, Feast of Saint Anthony of Padua, patron of the Holy Land. Upon that day, Bishop Boyea suggests we bring lilies, as is customary upon Saint Anthony's feast, to a local shrine or altar dedicated to Saint Anthony. Amongst other things, the lily honors Our Lady, Queen of Peace, and invokes her maternal intercession.








FOLLOWING OUR FAITH

Our Catholic Heritage

by Earl Hagen **193rd Pope - Boniface VIII** (1294-1303)

Born circa 1230 in Anagi, part of the Papal States and the Holy Roman Empire. Birth name, Benedetto Caetani. His granduncle was the 181at Pope. He joined the Order of Friars Minor. He was appointed a cardinal-Deacon in 1281, then a little over



10 years later, Cardinal-Priest, finally being elected Pope Dec 24, 1294.

Boniface was one of the most controversial popes for eight years and 291 days. He was in conflict with King Philip IV of France over the King's right to tax the clergy, as well as excommunicating him for taking control over land owned by an Italian family and giving it to his own, Boniface issued the most famous papal document of the Middle Ages, affirming the authority of the pope as the heir of Peter and Vicar of Christ over all human authorities, spiritual and temporal. Six years and eight months after Boniface's death, the 195th Pope allowed King Philip IV to conduct a two-year trial accusing the deceased pope of heresy and around Unam Sanctam, released a year before, he died in response to his long-standing battle with the King of France, declaring that the pope acted on the authority of God and he was the supreme ruler. Everyone should bow to him. The trial ended without bringing any charges against the former pope.

At the age of 68, Pope Boniface the VIII was abducted by the King of France, held for three days, hit in the face with a heavy mailed fist and then imprisoned, where he neither ate nor drank for 48 hours. Rescued, he was alert and rational, but a few days later unable to appear in public. He died five weeks after the severe beating. It is suggested he died of a subdural hematoma.

Pope Boniface VIII died on October 11, 1303.

Saint

June 1: St. Justin

St. Justin was a philosopher and a martyr. He was born of pagan parents at Flavia Neapolis in Samaria at the beginning of the second century. Following his conversion to the faith he wrote many works in defense of religion, of which we have only two: the Apology and the Dialogue with Trypho. He also opened a school at Rome in which public debates were held. Justin was martyred along with several companions during the reign of Marcus Aurelius around the year 165.






