

A CUP OF JOE

Greetings in Christ, all!

Every summer since I got here, I pick some outdoor projects to work on on my day off. It helps me to do physical labor and it saves the parish some money while knocking out jobs.

This year I've gone after our handicap ramp into the recto-

ry. It was rotted out and not usable. Apparently, it was installed when our current rectory was an office and required a handicap ramp. In the ensuing years, it had become unusable and dangerous. So, I ripped it out, disposed of the wood and planted grass where the ramp was. It was a lot of work and sweat and a lot of fun.

We also had a concrete set of stairs that were dangerous and unusable because of drainage. I took a sledgehammer to the concrete and broke a lot of it up and we're working on putting a stable set of stairs there to replace it.

Finally, you may have noticed that the west/south corner of the rectory had grown over with vines. The vines were messing up the brickwork and trying to grow into the windows so I was able to tear those out

I've got a few other projects like this that are fun for me and save some money for our parish. I always check my work with our maintenance guy, Mark, to make sure I'm doing things that help and don't get in his way. He has more work on his plate than any one man should, God bless him, so I'm glad this helps him focus on the more pressing things.

Next week I hit the beginning of my seventh year here. I moved here on July 1st of 2018. No kidding, I've never lived this long in one place since 1992. My previous record was six years in my last assignment and before that, it was every year or every other year that I moved...whew. This is actually my first assignment where I unpacked everything!

So, I just want to thank you for letting me be your priest. It means the world to me. It is not an exaggeration to say that I thank God for being here every morning.

Thank you for your patience and kindness with my limitations. Thank you for supporting me in taking care of my Dad. Thank you for praying for me. I love you all. I thank Jesus for you.




Catholic Charities Collection



The Perfect Storm

I am writing this on a Saturday morning. Saturdays are my writing days, when my husband takes over the kids and the house and I disappear into the office with an enormous cup of coffee and noise-canceling headphones. Saturdays are sacred — if work can be called sacred.

But Saturday morning is also the only time I'm able to consistently get to confession. Every other time the sacrament is offered in my area during the week, I seem to have unavoidable commitments — but on Saturday morning, all I have is work, and how can I let work come before a sacrament, as much as I might secretly want to?

I've spent a good deal of time being bitter about this, because it's just not convenient, having to carve out time from work to run to the other side of town, especially when I get there and there's a line. I sit there in the sanctuary, waiting my turn, checking the clock, stewing, fretting. Obsessing over forgetting one of my sins. Thinking of how much work I have when I get home.

Saturday mornings: a perfect storm, I sometimes call it in my head.

I forge ahead, though. I've never gotten up and dashed back to my desk. I make it into the confessional and I stammer out my pathetic little list and receive absolution. Then I go before the tabernacle to perform my penance.

It's while I am kneeling there that it happens. Always. God awakens, and he cries into the depths of my heart: "Quiet! Be still! Why are you terrified? Do you not yet have faith?"

After teaching all day by the shore of the sea, Jesus asks his disciples to remove him from the crowds. He wants to escape the noise, the clamor, the disquiet. But the clamor follows him, because the world is full of it. Storms crop up wherever we go.

Jesus sleeps through the storm, because he understands what the disciples do not: the storms of the world cannot hurt us. They are only so much noise.





The Holy Spirit wants to guide you in wisdom in each moment of the day. When we listen to the voice of God, and do what God is calling us to do, we live deeply fulfilling lives and our souls erupt with joy.

Our Catholic Heritage

144th Pope - John XIX

Born in Rome, he was Benedict VIII's brother, a member of the Tusculani family that followed the powerful Crescentii family as rulers of Rome. He was elected in May 1024. During his pontificate he had been elected as senator and put at the head of the



temporal government of the Church. After Henry II died in Germany, Conrad II "the Salian" was elected King in 1024. In Saint Peters, John XIX crowned him as Emperor in 1027, to help maintain relations with the German empire. He refused to consent to doubtful claims of the Byzantine court. He protected Guido d'Arezzo, the inventor of the seven musical notes, the names of which are first syllables of a psalm. Pope John XIX died December 1032.


