Our Catholic Heritage

145th Pope—Benedict IX

Born in Rome, he was elected pope in 1032 at the age of 12. He was thrust into the papacy by the Tusculani family. Highly devoted to Conrad II, he followed the imperialistic vein of his fami-



ly. In 1044, Benedict IX was forced to flee the power of the antagonistic Crescenzi family who replaced him with Sylvester III. He was notorious for selling the papacy, then reclaiming the office. While he excommunicated ecclesiastical leaders hostile to him, his violent and licentious conduct provoked the Romans to insurrection. He then fled Rome. Eventually he took refuge in the Monastery of Grottaferrata. He was elected pope three times (1032, 1045, 1047) and was the last of the popes from the powerful Tusculani family. Benedict IX died in 1055.
