


A CUP OF JOE







Our Catholic Heritage

37th Pope - Damasus I

Born in Spain to a Spanish noble family. His life coincided with the rise of Emperor Constantine I. He was elected October 1, 366 against anti-pope Ursicinus. In the elec-



tion, Damasus was backed by Emperor Valentinian I. This confirmed the supremacy of the Church in Rome designating the Roman Bishop as custodian of Orthodoxy in the West

During this time, the reunion of the Western and Eastern Roman Empires, is associated with the legitimization of Catholic Christianity and its later adoption as the official religion

of the Roman state in 380. Damasus was a learned Pope. He authorized the singing of the psalms by alternate choirs instituted by St. Ambrose. He introduced the use of the Hebrew term "alleluia" and had the Sacred Scriptures translated from Hebrew. Damasus died December 11, 384, and is buried in the Church of St. Lorenzo in Damaso.

June 5: St. Boniface

St. Boniface was born in England about the year 673. He was first professed in the monastic life at Exeter, but in 719 went to Germany to preach the Gospel. He made many converts there and was consecrated bishop, ruling over the church at Mainz. He attracted many companions by whose help he founded or restored dioceses in Bavaria, Thuringia and Franconia. He also convened councils and promulgated laws. He uprooted the superstition and idolatry of the pagans, eventually cutting down their sacred oak tree. While preaching the Gospel to the Frisians, Saint Boniface was killed by pagans in 754.



Year in Review

The Knights fraternal year ends in June. The Knights have been active in the areas of faith, family, community, and life. Below is a summary:

Faith • Our council donated \$500 to five different seminarians • The Knights continue to lead the Family Rosary the first Sunday of each month • Our council donates a teddy bear to newly baptized infants in the parish.

Family · Our council organizes a Consecration to the Holy Family each year around the Feast of the Holy Family

 Our council donated \$3,031 to the K of C Ukraine Solidarity Fund

Community · Our council collects and distributes coats, hats, and gloves to needy kids in the Flint area · We sponsored an essay contest at the school · We organized a free throw contest with the parish kids · Through our No Neighbor Left Behind program, we have donated and delivered beds, furniture, and appliances to local families in need · Our Adopt-A-Highway team cleaned trash from portions of I-475 three times this year.

Life • We partially subsidized St. Thomas More student's March for Life trip with a \$1,000 donation • Our Baby Bottle Drive raised \$11,000, which went toward the purchase of an ultrasound machine and was donated to local pregnancy clinics • We performed two Tootsie Roll Drives. We donated the proceeds of \$13,000 to local agencies to assist people with intellectual disabilities.

- Multiple truckloads of bedding, cribs, housewares, and building items to Habitat for Humanity, Catholic Charities, St. Luke's New Life Center, St. Vincent DePaul, etc.
- \$1,500 in support to Holy Family Outreach, \$500 In support to St. Luke's New Life Center, \$500 in support to Family Promise.
- Over \$23,000 in baby/kid's clothes to Heartbeat for new babies and their siblings donated by Laurie's in Grand Blanc.
- Over \$3,000 to Ukraine Refugee Relief.




